



## Inductive Study Tips

It so exciting that you have chosen to dig into inductive Bible study. Below are some tips for completing an inductive study.

-  Select and read a section of scripture each daily. I recommend that you read each scripture section in at least one other translations throughout the week.
  - Tips for finding a translation to read or listen.
    - Find an app to use as a resource for multiple Bible translations. I recommend YouVersion Bible app.
    - Word for Word Translations
      - NASB – New American Standard Bible
      - ESV – English Standard Version
      - KJV – King James Version
      - NKJV – New King James Version
      - TRB – The Readable Bible
    - Meaning for Meaning
      - GW - God's Word Translation
    - Thought for Thought
      - CSB – Christian Standard Bible
      - NIV – New International Version
      - NLT – New Living Translation
    - Paraphrase
      - NIRV – New International Reader's Version
      - CEV – Contemporary English Version
      - MSG – The Message
      - TPT – The Passion Translation
- With each verse or section of verses, you will ask yourself 3 questions. Take your time with the questions.
-  Question 2
  - Use your Bible's concordance or Blue Letter Bible App ([blueletterbible.org](http://blueletterbible.org)) to cross-reference the key word(s) or topic(s). (When I study in the New Testament, I like to cross-reference in the Old Testament.) Blue Letter Bible also has so many great commentaries – explanations or interpretations of scripture!
