Cooking and Dyslexia

Jamie Oliver, celebrity chef, author and champion for healthy school lunch programs is dyslexic. He has been very open about his struggles, from being undiagnosed, feeling stupid and worthless, and called names by his classmates. He is now using his celebrity to campaign for greater supports in schools, including early screenings for dyslexia and neurodiversity and more teacher training. He has produced a one hour documentary 'Jamie's Dyslexia Revolution' which explores the challenges and issues children with dyslexia face in Britain, and urges the government to fix the education system. In a recent post to Instagram he said 'I can't just sit back and watch this continue...I want every child to have a universal dyslexia screening check within their first two years of school. I want every educator to have the training to teach every child, not just the 75% of kids who fit the current system.'



From our Tutor-Trainer

The year is coming to a close and we look back proudly to report that the Learning Centre for Hamilton has once again run smoothly resulting in excellent progress with our children's literacy development and our tutors' Orton-Gillingham (OG) skills.

One of the reasons that the OG intervention technique is so powerful and effective is that it actually rewires the brain. The brain is such an amazing organ and scientists are increasingly finding how its characteristic of plasticity allows for such major changes to occur.

Regular, intense lessons are critical to this rewiring process, but the 'secret sauce' is the OG technique itself. The Academy of Orton-Gillingham Practitioners and Educators have recently revised their principles of OG. These nine principles are: Diagnostic and Prescriptive; Individualized; Language-Based and Alphabetic/Phonetic; Simultaneous Multisensory; Direct and Explicit; Structured, Sequential, and Cumulative, but Flexible; Synthetic and Analytic; Cognitive, and Emotionally Sound.

Helping tutors to thoughtfully craft and deliver their OG lessons, keeping these principles in mind takes such precision and expertise. We really do have a dedicated, thoughtful, and creative group of volunteer tutors to whom we are truly grateful. Our families are also deserving of praise as it can be challenging to keep up this twice a week schedule.

At our upcoming national conference there will be discussions around a variety of overarching topics of importance to all nine Learning Centres across Canada. I will introduce the possibility of changing how we assess our children's progress annually. An expert from the US was consulted and has helped to identify some potential new standardized tests and assessment tools that are more closely aligned with our Orton-Gillingham intervention technique and that may provide us with improved meaningful data. Stay tuned!

Cheers to all who helped our wonderful Learning Centre for Hamilton have such a great year!
