AGHOA Meeting



Updates from the Architectural Control Committee

Last month was quiet with no communication regarding property structures or home additions/remodels.

I did have some communications regarding the construction going on in some homeowner's side yards and backyards. (Some have called it destruction because the construction folks have been digging holes and creating a lot of mud amidst the snow and water.) Some homeowners received notices on their property doors but not everyone.

Anyway, this is what I have learned. Xcel has contracted with Q3 Inc to install replacement electrical service runs throughout selected sections of the neighborhood. Q3 is tunneling underground and pulling large electrical wires underneath the yards of homes; sometimes a few homes but also sometimes many homes at a time.

The wires will be hooked up to the existing distribution boxes that service the homes. The overall purpose is to replace old wiring, with failing insulation, that has been in the ground for over 30 years. No date was provided for completion of the neighborhood.

I am here to assist you in any additional structural or home addition/remodel. I will try to help you understand Douglas County codes and regulations and to help you navigate through the paperwork required by the County for indoor and outdoor building projects. The Douglas County Building Dept in Castle Rock can be reached at 303-660-7497 – Dial 0 for Building Dept.

Issues regarding public right-of-way (roads) are under the authority of the Douglas County Sheriff, who can be reached at a non-emergency phone number; 303-660-7505.

Issues regarding activities at residences which are disturbing to the neighborhood are under the authority of Douglas County Zoning Compliance; phone number 303-660-7460.

Toxic household products can be harmful to pets, wildlife, sanitation workers, our health, and the environment if poured down the drain, toilet or storm sewer, or put in the trash. You can properly dispose of and recycle toxic products from your home with Douglas County's Household Hazardous Waste Collection Program. Douglas County residents are eligible for one collection appointment per calendar year.

Please note a \$30 co-payment is required from the resident for each appointment.

Once you get to the website you will find a list of items normally collected and those that are not collected. Click on the "contact us" menu item at the top of the page. You can then go to "Customer Service Center" to request a "kit" for collection of your items and schedule a pick up.

Because every snowstorm is different – temperature, moisture content, wind velocity, and storm duration, etc. – we implement a snow removal plan unique to each storm. The primary focus is always on public safety. During the storm, plows will be out until all roads are plowed.

- 1. Main roads are cleared curb to curb.
- 2. Residential streets receive one or two passes but are not plowed curb to curb (so we don't cover up sidewalks) and are not plowed to bare pavement, you should expect to drive on packed snow.
- 4. After routes are complete, which may be a day or two after snow stops, crews will address priority ice complaints. Priority ice complaints are those where icing is built up and covering sidewalks, icing in intersections, and on hills. (A patch of ice in a parking lane of a residential street is not a priority.)

Generally, complaints may take 5-7 days to address and may not be done in the order they are received. Callers can leave a phone number but should not expect a return call since staff and crews are busy plowing and addressing ice complaints.

Bees –Brrr, It's Been Cold Outside

This winter has been harsh – not only for us humans but for the bees as well. I have only put insulation sheets around the hive once, several years ago.

If you ever read through the various bee groups on Facebook, I would say the majority of them either don't insulate at all or, as I did, wrap with tar paper and put up a moisture barrier on each hive.

Then the nasty weather arrived. At first, I thought the hives would make it but then the temps really dropped at night. That's when I became concerned.

What could I do at that point? All I could do was wait for temps in the 50's so I could open the hives. When I did watch the hives during the cold spell, three looked dead, as in dead as a doornail – no activity at all.

I didn't hold out much hope. I decided that I lost three out of four hives to the cold. Then we had a respite from the cold for a few days so I decided to do a hive check — to see if any of the hives survived. Of the three hives I only lost one.

I was so relieved and happy that there were still three but sad to have lost the one. There was a silver lining; I harvested about a little over a pint of honey from the dead hive.


The two that survived required me to begin the feeding process. I open the top box, put down a layer of newsprint and pour 4 pounds of raw sugar onto the paper. I did this last winter and the two hives survived so I'm hoping this get all three through the winter months.

Plan ahead, give yourself sufficient time and plan your route.

 Give yourself extra time--don't assume a clear path for driving and walking will be available.

Wear shoes or boots that provide traction on snow and ice.

- Footwear made of rubber and neoprene composite provide better traction than plastic and leather soles.
- Avoid shoes with heels.
- Products are available with abrasive soles or cleats that provide special traction for walking on snow and ice, such as Yaktrax.

Use special care when entering and exiting vehicles, climbing or descending stairs, entering or leaving buildings.

- Move slowly.
- Remove snow/water from shoes when entering buildings.
- Use handrails for support or a cane.
- Try to keep your center of gravity over your support leg.
- Use car for support.
- Keep your hands out of your pockets for balance.

Walk on designated walkways as much as possible.

- Don't take shortcuts over snow piles or areas where snow & ice have not been removed.
- Look ahead when you walk. A sidewalk completely covered with ice or snow may require walking along its grassy edge for traction.
- Don't text or read while walking.
- Walk safely on snow or ice.
- Take short steps or shuffle for stability.
- Bend slightly forward and walk flat-footed with your center of gravity directly over your feet as much as possible.
- Be prepared to fall. If you fall, fall with sequential contacts at your thigh, hip and shoulder. Avoid using outstretched arms to brace yourself.
- Bend your back and head forward to avoid hitting your head against the ground.

Spring Cleaning for Seniors

Work in small chunks of time

Break up tasks into small chunks , this will make cleaning up much more manageable and motivating.

Make getting rid of clutter a priority

Decluttering helps you free up space, decrease stress, and even relieve insomnia. Removing clutter from your home also reduces your risk of tripping and falling.

Leave the heavy lifting to someone else

To prevent injuries, do not try to move heavy objects or furniture on your own. It's important to stay safe while spring cleaning, especially if you have reduced strength or mobility issues.

Check your medicine cabinets

If you find expired medications or medications you no longer need, properly dispose of them.

Heart Healthy Valentine's Day Treats

5-Ingredient No Bake Strawberry Tart

- 3/4 c. dates chopped
- 3/4 c. rolled oats
- 1/4 c. walnuts
- 8 oz. yogurt choose your favorite
- 2-4 Strawberries

In a food processor or blender, combine dates, rolled oats, & walnuts until crumbly mixture. Divide mixture in half & press in a small (4-5 inch) non-stick tart pan. Spoon in half of yogurt in each tart. Top with desired number of strawberries.

Red Velvet Energy Balls

- ½ C Rolled oats
- 12 soft Dates
- 1/3 C Almond or Peanut butter
- 2T Protein powder
- 2T Ground flax or chia seed
- 1t Red hibiscus powder
- ¼ C Chocolate or carob chips chopped

Combine all ingredients and roll into balls and dust with Cocoa or Carob Powder.

Frozen Yogurt Strawberry Bites

- 1/2 cup nonfat blended strawberry Greek yogurt (not fruit on the bottom yogurt)
- 3 1/2 tablespoons 100% fruit seedless strawberry jelly
- 4 teaspoons mini chocolate chips or chopped regular size

Combine yogurt and jelly. Chop chocolate chips and add them to the yogurt mixture, stirring thoroughly. Spoon mixture into heart shaped molds, or dollop from a spoon onto a parchment-lined baking sheet. If using molds, tap gently on counter so the yogurt levels smoothly. Add toothpicks or cut straws to 3", place in center of pops and freeze solid.


