# **Updates from the Architectural Control Committee**

### By Jim Hope

In Acres Green we continue to have lots of activity related to the hail damage from almost a year ago. Folks are replacing roofs, siding and various door and window trim in multiple locations. None of the above listed requires ACC approval, if no structural modifications are made, but we

are always glad to assist you if you have questions. Douglas County Building Dept Permits are required, however, so be sure you or your contractor has pulled the required permits.

Thanks to the folks that are replacing their damaged fences and to those that are doing general yard cleanup. It inspires us all when we live in a clean and organized environment.

Douglas County's Stage 1 Fire Restrictions have now been increased to Stage 2, as of July 2nd for all of unincorporated Douglas county, which includes Acres Green.

#### STAGE 2 Restrictions include:

#### Not allowed:

- Open burning of any kind.
- Use of fireworks including professional firework displays
- Use of fires in chimineas, other portable fireplaces or patio fire pits.
- Campfires at developed campgrounds or picnic areas.

#### Allowed:

- Fires within liquid-fueled or gas-fueled stoves, grills, fire pits or other gas or liquid fueled appliance.
- Residential use of charcoal grill fires when such use is supervised by a responsible party at least 18 years of age.
- Fires contained within fire places and wood burning stoves within buildings only.

South Metro Fire has been on alert since the brush fire in Highlands Ranch in late June, and several fires cause by fireworks in July. Please be safe. Additional information can be found at: https://www.southmetro.org/DocumentCenter/View/1540/Recreational-Fires?bidId=





Remain calm, and enjoy these Corona-virus cookies made with concentrated Corona beer complete with pretzel protein spikes and lime glaze single-stranded RNA. Makes 2-1/2 dozen

### Ingredients:

- 2 (12 oz.) bottles of Corona beer (pale lager) (or if you don't want to use beer substitute, 2 Tbsp. honey/syrup)
- 2 Tbsp. brown sugar
- 1 cup (2 sticks) unsalted butter, room temperature
- 3/4 cup sugar
- 1 egg, room temperature
- 1/2 of a lime, zested
- 2 cups all-purpose flour
- 1 tsp baking powder
- 1/4 tsp salt
- Pretzel sticks, broken into thirds

#### **ICING**

- 1 cup powdered sugar
- 1/2 of a lime, zested (reserved from dough)
- 1 lime, juiced (from the zested halves)

#### **Directions:**

Pour beer and brown sugar into a medium pot and set over mediumhigh heat. Bring to a boil and then reduce heat to a simmer. For approximately 30 minutes, let it reduce down to a syrup (about 2 tablespoons), keeping a close eye on it towards the end to make sure it doesn't get too thick.

In a large bowl, cream the butter and sugar until light and fluffy. Beat in egg, reduced beer, and lime zest until just combined. Slowly beat in flour, baking powder, and salt until it comes together into a dough.

Shape dough into two discs, wrap in plastic wrap, and refrigerate for at least 2 hours.

Preheat oven to 350 degrees and line baking sheets with parchment or silicone baking mats. On a clean, floured surface, roll out one of the discs of dough to a little less than ¼-inch thick. Cut with round cookie cutter and place on prepare cookie sheets 2 inches apart. Re-roll scraps and remaining dough to make more cut outs. Stick pretzel pieces into the dough around the edges.

Bake for 8-10 minutes, until set but not yet turning golden on the bottom edges. Let cool for 10 minutes before transferring to a wire rack to cool completely.

**Icing:** Mix all ingredients in a medium bowl until pasty. For a thicker frosting, add more powdered sugar, 1 tablespoon at a time, until you reach your desired consistency. For thinner icing add more lime juice. Decorate cooled cookies with icing and allow to firm before stacking or storing.
