It is really slow – no permits requested so far but that is to be expected. I do see that folks are working on the inside of some homes and I hope that the appropriate permits are being requested; they are for your safety as well your family. Interior permits, excluding window replacements, don't come under the review of the ACC so just be

come under the review of the ACC so just be smart. IF you have any doubts, contact the Douglas County Building Department and just ask the question;

Do I need a permit to replace the water heater? (Answer is Yes)

Do I need a permit to replace my stove? (Answer yes or no - it depends on if you are replacing the service from say electric to gas - the new gas line would need a permit)

So just give them a call or go down to Castle Rock and walk in. They have many handouts that would explain requirements for say a deck or home addition. If you don't see a pamphlet that pertains to your question, just ask, they don't bite.

Finally, in the last article I mentioned that I was "retiring" from the ACC once I found a replacement. I have! Jim Hope has stepped up to give it a try. I will still help out with questions or if he is out of town and a permit is requested, I can fill in for him.



AGHOA Meeting Minutes

The last AGHOA meeting was held on Dec. 19 at the Lone Tree Hub.

The first order of business was a discussion regarding including paper shredding and electronics recycling with our Dumpster Day events. The electronics recycling company does do paper shredding, but they charge for that service. At this time the officers are looking for another service to add to our Dumpster Day events, which would take appliances.

Spring and Fall Dumpster Days are planned for this year; however, the dates are to be determined.

The discussion turned to the annual neighborhood garage sales. The dates are set for Fri. and Sat., June 5 & 6.

Next the discussion turned to a possible neighborhood picnic possibly in August. Or possibly a fall farmers' market or an Octoberfest. Ideas were suggested, but no decision was made.

The decision was made to hold the next Neighborhood Watch meeting on April 16. Angela reported that crime has increased so it will be good to have the Neighborhood watch meeting to discuss this.

A suggestion was made to contact the county regarding possibly putting a roundabout or two on Maximus Dr. Since the proposal for the hospital we have seen the possibility of more people cutting through the neighborhood to avoid the traffic on Park Meadows Dr. and Yosemite. The installation of of roundabouts could help slow traffic. Ron volunteered to call the country to see how we could proceed.

Sandy presented the Treasurer's report. The details are in this newsletter. Lenora was not present to report on memberships, but those who have paid their dues thus far are listed in this newsletter. Jean took the memberships and will send the info to Lenora.

The next discussion was regarding the fact that several people did not get the last newsletter in the mail. Jean sent a note to Kerri regarding this issue. For the next issue we will likely need to do a survey online to see who got it and who didn't.

Ron was commended for adding snowflakes to the Christmas decorations at both entrances.

Ron made a presentation regarding the plantings at the Front and East Entrance Signs. The details of the plantings in the plan are in this newsletter. Following Ron's presentation, a motion was made and seconded to spend up to \$1,000 for South Suburban Parks and Rec.'s Matching Gifts Program for replacement of the plantings at both entrances.

Ron also mentioned that the school grounds are not being maintained as they were when the district worked with South Suburban for that. Ron has been working with the district on this issue. Some things have been fixed.

Ron also announced that he was planning to quit as ACC representative. Please welcome Jim Hope, our new ACC representative. His contact info is on the front page of this newsletter.

After the meeting all adjourned to the Grist Brewery for some delicious baked goods and some fellowship.

SSPR Matching Gifts Program

The Matching Gifts Program through South Suburban Parks and Recreation District, provides a way for individuals, neighborhoods, homeowner associations, sports groups, businesses, and other organizations to join with South Suburban Parks and Recreation (SSPR) in the development of their particular projects.

Projects that are less than \$2,000 are more likely to be approved for funding than requests in excess of that amount. The AGHOA has, over the years, submitted suggestions. Some have been approved and some not.

Some projects that have been approved were for the picnic table in the rest area next to the trail on the east side of the neighborhood. Another was for the covered picnic table and barbeque stand in Altair Park.

This year we are hoping to have a new project approved – the redesign of both the north and east entrances around the Acres Green signs. These two areas, especially the north entrance need a makeover. The ugly green bushes have grown over the years to the point they obscure the sign.

As a result, we have worked with Larry Hurd, the horticulturalist from SSPR. He has come up with a plan to reinvigorate both entrances. Here are the suggested plants that would replace the existing bushes. We should hear if our plan is approved sometime in March. The cost for the project is roughly \$1,700. If approved the AGHOA would be responsible for about \$850.

7 Life Tips for Seniors That Make Everyday Life Easier

- 1. Reach items in the back of the refrigerator by placing a lazy susan on top of a shelf so you can easily rotate what you need to the front.
- 2. Add raised dot stickers to key phone and TV remote control buttons to help you know which buttons to press. Like adding bumps to the "On/Off" and volume buttons make them easier to find.
- 3. Round out sharp furniture corners to prevent injury. Soften those corners of counters, coffee tables, or nightstands with by adding stick-on corner guards or moldable putty that dries into rubber.
- 4. Simple rubber bands can be wrapped around cups and mugs to make them easier for weak, shaky, or arthritic hands to grip. Also, for thinner objects like toothbrushes or pens. Foam grips that enlarge the handle may be even more comfortable.
- 5. Keep the straw in place while drinking. If you are chasing the straw around your cup, tape the straw to a clothespin and clip it to the glass. This keeps the straw in place when the cup moves.
- 6. Prevent soap from falling to the shower floor using one leg of panty hose. Put the bar of soap into the foot and tie the top end to the shower head or a handy grab bar. This prevents a dangerous falling hazard as well as added convenience.
- 7. Organize and keep track of medications using a simple calendar stuck to the refrigerator or a printed spreadsheet/log is a simple and accurate way to track when medicine is taken. Pill organizers make sure the correct pills are taken at the right times of day and inexpensive plastic bins or shoe boxes keep medicine bottles organized.
