However, this is a good time of year to perform yard cleanup, to have trees trimmed and removed, if necessary. I give this reminder because just this week we had a wind storm and my neighbor's dead 40-foot tree blew over into our yard causing unnecessary damage to a fence, and other buildings. If your trees are dead or badly in need of trimming, the cost to trim/remove may be less than the deductible on your insurance, should you have an incident.

Dogs are like our children. Sam is ours

I know you've all heard the claims: "My dog would never bite you...", "You must have teased my dog for him to bite you..", "how did he get loose? I'm so sorry he would never bite you.."

How about replacing 'bite you' with 'bite your dog'. As a lot of you know,

I have walked the Acres Green neighborhood for going on 5 or 6 years now, both for my health but also for the health of my best buddy Sam. He is one of the gentlest dogs you will ever meet. Say something to him, and he will roll over on his back and wait for you to rub his stomach, even if he didn't know you.

Early in December Sam was attacked by two dogs as we were walking our daily route. As I crested the little hill on the road where the attack occurred, I saw a man on a bicycle with two dogs that I thought were his.

Well, it took all of two or three seconds for the dogs to leave the man on the bicycle and to see Sam and I, and they were upon Sam. I tried to protect Sam but the one dog was determined. It attacked at least twice and the second lunge he latched on to Sam. I screamed for help as I was kicking and punching the dog to get him to off Sam. The man, who I thought owned the dogs, came up only to mumble something and pointed to his ears – he was deaf. I found out later he was being harassed by these two dogs as well.

At the same time, the owner and her son came out to help. It took the three of us men beating on the dog to pull the dog off Sam. I called 911 and then my wife to pick us up.

There was blood all over me and Sam. We both sat there in the street, both shaking, waiting for my wife to pick us up to take Sam to the emergency vet. I will always wonder what could have happened if no one was around or heard me yelling.

What took maybe a minute or two before they pulled the dog off Sam, has taken just about a month for the healing process to complete, at least externally. The worst was the first day when they ask whether we would want or not want a DNR (Do Not Resuscitate) because he is an older dog, 13 years old, and they were going to perform surgery. That was hard.

He ended up having three surgeries and we had to bring him in for eight or nine days straight to have his body wrap replaced. The wrap was to keep everything "connected." In the end I added up what this cost; \$5,034.00. If it was twice this amount, it would have been worth it to have him back with us.

So, the next time you let you dog run loose whether in the park or just down the street, think about it because you "think" you know your dog but you really don't "know" your dog, no matter how trained he may be or how well behaved. This is why I keep harping in articles, and shouting at you in the park; **put your dog on a leash**. And the \$5000.00 bill next time might just be yours if you don't have control (leashed.)


