It's been an opportunity to create meaningful relationships with the neighbors you didn't know who live down the street, or the new family that just moved in. This is an opportunity for the HOA members to connect with their neighbors and bring a positive face to the HOA.

My suggestions are to implement the revival of multiple Holiday contests which is my most recent contributions to the community. If elected I plan to continue to pursue similar community events.

My experience includes holding numerous leadership positions within diverse communities. Going back as far as the Navy Wives Club in Japan in the late 70's/early 80's. Throughout the years I've spent time volunteering as a Day Camp director for a camp of 180+ Girl Scouts and Adults for 10 years, responsible for each years' camp from planning to execution. Additionally, in my last HOA, we turned an acre of donated land in the middle of our community into an amazing wooden playground that still stands today. This involved a 3 year plan from conception to finish and it remains useful to this day in Lakeridge, Virginia. In recent years I have been directly involved with the Acres Green PTO and the local Cub Scouts.

My vision as the President for Acres Green HOA is to provide additional avenues for neighbors to come together. We can accomplish this by creating a decorating community for the two entrances, potentially bring back the neighborhood watch or any other ideas that community members want to bring forth. Expanding on the sense of belonging and looking out for one another drives my commitment to live here. My inspiration is to ensure our new homeowners value this neighborhood as much as those who have been here for years. I look forward to being your president and representing you.



Median.

SSPR mowed the weeds along the median a few weeks ago. By the end of September or early October, we should see more activity along the median. They will be doing tree mitigation by trimming out the dead branches or removing trees that need to be replaced. New trees will be replacing those removed. Additionally, they will be doing work in the median by introducing additional native grasses where needed along with additional weed mitigation.

Lonesome Pine Park.

If you have kids going to Acres Green Elementary or if you drive by the park, you should see fencing surrounding the area where they will be removing old equipment and updating the play area with new playground equipment. At this time we don't have a completion date, but I would expect that they should be done by October/November time frame.

Maximus Drive Update

"Mr. Ron Brink,

The community concern about the additional lane line striping on Maximus Drive has been received by the Douglas County Traffic Engineering Department.

Last year in November 2021, Douglas County Traffic Services did install a painted entry island and neck down area at Sweetwater Park trail crossing to reduce the speeds on Maximus. If this proved effective, a more permanent raised curb entry median island feature may be constructed in conjunction with 2022 Concrete Construction Maintenance Projects.

Upon the completion of the permanent raised median, it is still the County's intention to install the proposed parking and bicycle lane lines on both sides Maximus Drive from Delphi Drive to the trail crossing at Sweetwater Park based on weather and paint availability.

Last year Douglas County had to make a difficult decision on which roadways to repaint with less roadway paint. This year a continued shortage of roadway paint due to a nationwide resin shortage combined with last year's paint famine, Douglas County continues to focus on restriping critical areas such as major arterials and collector roadways.

Paint is getting harder to come by, as manufactures continue to recover for these setbacks, Douglas County still has to face much adversity with supply issues and labor challenges.

Douglas County Traffic Engineering will also be deploying speed radar feedback signs within the next few weeks and will add Maximus Drive on the Douglas County Sheriff's target enforcement list."

Fall and Winter Coming By Ron Brink

As we close out the summer months, I'm seeing a lot of bee activity. They are finishing with (hopefully) filling the supers (our honey.) I will be making final hive inspections for mites and removing the supers for harvesting.

Harvesting is a great time when we see the results of the bees' work. Earlier in August, I harvested one super (halfbox) and was able to get 1.6 gallons of honey. Not sure how much we will get this fall, but I'm keeping my fingers crossed.

Once harvesting is done, winterizing is our next step. I need to make sure they are filling up the brood boxes with honey and food. I might need to feed them if they need extra help for honey stores by putting on sugar water feeders.

I will be putting opening reducers to reduce the entrance for the winter but also to prevent hive robbers, other bees from somewhere else, stealing honey. I will also be wrapping each hive in #15 tar paper. This will promote heating of the hive during the winter months.

The last step is cleaning up any frames to be used next spring and storing them, somewhere, because I now have four hives and my shed hasn't grown.




