At the AGHOA meeting in December a long time resident and former postal employee mentioned that by using the +four digits of you zip code you could reduce the amount of sales tax you pay on items particularly those delivered to your home.

The sales tax rate for Acres Green residents, we are unincorporated Douglas County, in the RTD and SCFD, is 5%. The rate for Lone Tree residents, who share our zip code, is 6.8125%

I have personally noticed that by using the +four digits of our zip code that when ordering online I can enter the city as Littleton, as has been historically correct even though we are not located in a city. I haven't tried using Acres Green, but that would be a nice test.

Still quiet in the hood. The only item to report is a permit for an addition to a home. Addition maybe a stretch because the addition is bumping out the master bathroom to enlarge it. The really big stuff is inside. I had an opportunity to meet the contractor and he gave me a tour of what they had planned. From the outside you wouldn't know much of anything was being done. The inside is where all the action is. It was nice to see they are enhancing the house for a new neighbor who needs a little extra help.

I have a little correction regarding window and door replacements. I had originally told several folks, when I was called about this, that as long as they were replacing the existing windows/doors no permit – WRONG!

The reason is that the building department needs to make sure that you haven't illegally opened up the size by, for example, cutting into the header above the door or window. I recently had the front door replaced and to my surprise the contractor told me a permit was needed even though I was making no modifications to the original frame opening.

Just remember, if in doubt about a need for a permit, give me a call.

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## AGHOA Meeting Minutes

We had the luxury of having the Lone Tree Symphony as background music as they

practiced during the AGHOA meeting on Feb. 21, at the Hub in Lone Tree.

The first order of business was the proposed Cell Towers. A resident spoke with Bret Collins, of South Suburban Parks and Rec., who was not aware of the request for the placement of one of these cell towers at the bottom of Lonesome Pine Park.

Kaitlin Zeller is the Douglas county planner for The Helena Circle location (Lonesome Pine Park). Notices should be going to all residents who are affected by the tower, we will be updated as soon as the county is notified.

The primary concerns regarding the tower voiced by residents in the surrounding areas are health and the look of the tower. If you have concerns with these towers, please send a letter to the county stating your objection, location, color, placement, etc. The Douglas County Planning department: 303-660-7460, 100 Third Street, Castle Rock, CO 80104.

Neighborhood Watch was planned for April 18th and due to a conflict, has been moved to June 20th.

Some residents voiced concerns about houses that have multiple families living in 1 house or cars that appear to have been abandoned. These are possible violations of county zoning codes. If residents have concerns, they can call the county to report on a case by case basis and the county will investigate. Douglas County Zoning: 303-660-7460, 100 Third Street, Castle Rock, CO 80104.

Regarding building around Us: South Suburban is planning on building a new recreation center at Countyline & Holly that will include an ice-skating rink along with other activities. Expected completion date December 2020.

Surveyors have been noticed around the neighborhood and they have stated it is for "a small water project" but we haven't heard anything else.

C470 work is moving along. The toll will be variable based on volume and time of day.

Sandy presented the Treasurers report. We had \$663 deposited in the past 2 months from member dues. Expenses included: Xcel energy for lighting of the East Entrance sign and the mailing of the Greenleaf newsletter.

The account balance is over \$2900. The anticipated upcoming expenses include Trash Truck for "dumpster day" which is less than \$700. We are going to add paper shredding this year at the cost of \$500 for paper shredding.

Mona is organizing business sponsorship for the dumpster day to reduce the cost the AGHOA. Electronic Recycling is free to the AGHOA members, there is a small charge, to the homeowner for items such as "Tube TVs" but most items to be recycled will be free.

Some residents brought up the possibility of adding household chemicals to our clean ups, but we don't see the feasibility of doing that. Douglas County Household Chemical Round up is scheduled 3 times a year for that purpose. Please see the article in this newsletter for more information.

The AGHOA voted to make 2 banners each for 3' x 8' banners to advertise the Dumpster Day and the 4th of July parade. With the PAGE 5

possibility to have them front/back to save on space.

Membership: We had 145 members for last year. The numbers for 2019 were not available.

**Upcoming Events:** 

June 15th is the Dumpster Day 9-11a.m. The event will include paper shredding and Electronic recycling.

July 4th parade: We would like to include more floats and classic cars this year. We also would like to add music this year. Let's make it big and fun! We also invite more people out to watch. Yogi's is set up to do the ice cream.

We are looking at the possibility of inviting our locally owned businesses to be present at Altair Park during the 4th of July activities. More information will be available in the June Greenleaf and on Nextdoor.

May 31st and June 1st are scheduled for the annual Acres Green Neighborhood Garage sales. See more info in this issue of the Greenleaf.

Garden Day: Will be in April 27th 10am-12pm weather permitting. Please volunteer and help! Adult volunteers 18 and over. Parents who wish to include their children under 18 must be present to supervise. Community service for high schoolers is available. We will be cleaning up the front garden and other areas in the community. More info will be on Nextdoor

SAC: The new budget was discussed as the bond got passed. Next SAC meeting is in March. Acres Green elementary will stay and improved as the funds are available since the bond was passed. Look at the sign along Acres Green Drive for details on what the plans are.

ACC: Remember to get approval prior to submitting a permit that Architecturally. Also verify your contractor calls for the final inspection and the permit gets closed. See Ron's article in this newsletter for more info.

# **Household Chemical Roundups**

The Tri-County Health Department organizes the Household Chemical Roundups for Douglas County in the spring and summer. The Household Chemical Roundups in Douglas County are open to all Douglas County Residents. Proof of residency is required. A \$25 fee is collected per vehicle.

The roundups are open from 9 a.m.—3 p.m on the following dates:

- Sat., May 18 in Parker at the Joint Service Center, 17801 Plaza Dr.
- Sat., Aug. 10 in Highands Ranch at Shea Stadium, 3270 Redstone Park Cr.
- Sat., September 21 in Castle Rock at Castle Rock Water, 175 Kellog Ct.

What items are accepted at Household Chemical Roundup events? Acceptable items collected during the Household Chemical Roundup events include paint and paint products, motor oil, antifreeze, automotive fluids and fuels, vehicle batteries, household batteries, solvents, house and garden chemicals, fluorescent light bulbs, compact fluorescent lights (CFLs), cleaning supplies, items containing mercury, propane tanks, and passenger vehicle and pickup truck tires off the rim.

What items are NOT accepted at the Household Chemical Roundups? Household Chemical Roundup events cannot accept waste from businesses, and are not able to accept radioactive waste, smoke detectors, electronic waste of any kind, oil drums, asbestos, sharps/medical waste or explosives.

# **Death in the Hive**

It was a cold winter, too cold, I guess. Our one remaining hive died. Prior to the cold snap in late February, we saw activity when the temps reached above 50 degrees.

They looked like they were searching for water and basic house cleaning (removing the dead bees.)

Just prior to the big blizzard in March the temps got above 50 for three days so we decided to do a quick inspection because even with the warm weather we hadn't seen any recent activity. When I opened the hive, it was a total loss. We think that they starved to death. We thought they had enough honey to get through the winter but it was colder than the past few years.

That is the only thing we can come up with because the bees looked healthy. We checked the frames where the honey had been stored back in the fall and there was nothing left. The honeycomb was all that was left. It looks like it is back to the beginning.

We have ordered one new box of 15,000 bees. The bees we lost were Italian bees. We are switching to Carniolan honey bees. They are the most widely used honey bees. The Carniolan bees originates from Slovenia and Austria, two countries where this race is particularly popular.

The Carniolan bee behavior in the comb is more docile and calm, the sense of orientation to their surroundings is arguably the best of any race, their brood is highly resistant to diseases and parasites, they consume less food over the winter, they have explosive spring buildup which may cause swarming, they are less prone to robbing and spreading diseases in other colonies. They do well in this locale.

Wish us well in the new summer. We hope to still have honey in the fall. More updates to come.

- 5. Clean items before displaying them.
- 6. Display small valuable items close to the checkout area.
- 7. Place breakables out of children's reach.
- 8. Place big showy pieces closest to the street.
- 9. Display adult and big kid's clothes on hangers.
- 10. Leave space between tables for shoppers can get through to browse.
- 11. Display baby and small children's clothes on tables.
- 12. Have an outlet or extension cord handy for customers checking electrical items.
- 13. Remove all non-sale items from the area.
