It's been a great couple of months in Acres Green! From the Garden Day in April, Garage Sales the 1st weekend of June, along with Dumpster/E-Recycling/Paper Shredding day and the 4th of July Parade and Ice Cream Social, we've had a blast!

Thank you to the neighbors that came out and helped a little extra to spread the word, unload trailers and cheered for the Parade on the 4th of July!

The Dumpster Day event was such a success that we filled the trash truck early (holds the amount of 3 dumpsters), we filled the E-Recycling Truck and shredded over 3,000 lbs. of paper!

Because of the great success had with Dumpster Day (and because we filled the truck early), we decided to host another on Saturday, September 28 from 9:00-11:00 am. The event will be held once again in the school parking lot and you must be a paid member of the HOA to participate. And for those that pay in September prior or at the event, your dues will carry you through 2020!

Updates from the Architectural Control Committee

Looks like the neighborhood is in full work mode. There are trash roll-offs all over. There is a lot of home remodeling going on. We have a new homeowner that is not only moving in but has applied for a permit for a major addition. I'm looking forward to seeing the results.

Others are putting up backyard firepits, others building out a new patio. I've had questions on privacy fences as well. Hot-tubs too. All these firepits, patio build outs or fences don't normally need a permit. It is always good to ask though. The best advice I can give for these is to call 811 for a locate on your property, so you don't dig up underground wires. The service is free so better to check before digging, cutting into those wires could be dangerous and expensive.

Last newsletter I wrote an opinion on the appearance of Acres Green or rather the downturn for some residences. Either these folks don't read the newsletter or don't care to send comments to me. I have received many emails supporting or rather agreeing with my observation. One said: "... there are "some" residents who do not maintain a respectable residence. In fact, there are fair number of horrible residences." It has bothered this long time resident that he plans on leaving Acres Green. Another mentioned some of the fences next to parks are not in their best shape but others have fixed them or totally replaced the old fence. There is one individual that has a barking German Shepard and the dog has broke about seven slats – his home backs to Maximus Trail Park. It really looks bad.

So mention something to these folks – they may not even be aware that it is their responsibility. These fences are your responsibility. If you have a neighbor whose property is dumpy, try talking to them. There may be a reason they are not taking care of the property; maybe they are elderly and need help or there could be a medical reason. You might offer to help.

Household Chemical Roundups

The Tri-County Health Department organizes the Household Chemical Roundups for Douglas County in the spring and summer. The Household Chemical Roundups in Douglas County are open to all Douglas County Residents. Proof of residency is required. A \$25 fee is collected per vehicle.

The roundups are open from 9 a.m. - 3 p.m on the following dates:

- Saurday, August 10 in Highands Ranch at Shea Stadium, 3270 Redstone Park Cr.
- Saturday, September 21 in Castle Rock at Castle Rock Water, 175 Kellog Ct.

What items are accepted at Household Chemical Roundup events?

Acceptable items collected during the Household Chemical Roundup events include paint and paint products, motor oil, antifreeze, automotive fluids and fuels, vehicle batteries, household batteries, solvents, house and garden chemicals, fluorescent light bulbs, compact fluorescent lights (CFLs), cleaning supplies, items containing mercury, propane tanks, and passenger vehicle and pickup truck tires off the rim.

What items are NOT accepted at the Household Chemical Roundups?

Household Chemical Roundup events cannot accept waste from businesses, and are not able to accept radioactive waste, smoke detectors, electronic waste of any kind, oil drums, asbestos, sharps/medical waste or explosives.

Tips for Communicating with Someone with Dementia

- Set a positive mood for interaction, with body language, touch and voice tone.
- Remove distractions like TV and radio. Move to a quiet setting. Address them by name and identify yourself by name and relationship. Use gentle touch and maintain eye contact.
- Speak slowly and clearly using simple words and sentences. Allow time for a response and rephrase the statement if they seem confused. Use names of people and places not he, she, they or there.
- Ask simple questions that offer yes or no answers. Use visual prompts to help them see the topic clearly.
- Patience: The capacity to accept, tolerate and delay problems or suffering without becoming annoyed or anxious.
