REPUBLICAN ELECTION JUDGES NEEDED IN AACO

Early Voting is from 10/24 through 10/31. General Election Day is 11/5/24

As of September 2024, the Anne Arundel County Board of Elections needs 2,251 total election judges to fully staff all of the polling places in the county. There are 1,348 election judges that have applied and are being trained.

They still need 903 election judges for election day on 11/5/24.

Election Judges may apply to work Early Voting days and/or General Election Day. Election Judges staff nine (9) Early Voting sites and one hundred and forty-three (143) polling places throughout Anne Arundel County during the Primary and General Elections.

ELECTION JUDGE COMPENSATION

All Election Judges are compensated \$250.00 or \$350.00, depending on position, for their services for Early Voting and Election Day. All Election Judges are required to attend a mandatory training class. Election Judges will be paid \$50.00 for attending training (\$50.00 for the training class is contingent on you working as an Election Judge). Mandatory Pre-Election night setup pay is an additional \$25.00. All Election Judges can expect payment six to eight weeks after the Primary and General Elections.

ELECTION JUDGE QUALIFICATIONS

To be an Election Judge, you:

- 1. Must be a Maryland registered voter residing in the jurisdiction where you will serve, except that:
- a. If a qualified individual residing in the jurisdiction cannot be found with reasonable effort, the Anne Arundel County Board of Elections may appoint any Maryland registered voter; and
- b. The Anne Arundel County Board of Elections may appoint a minor at least 16 years old, if the minor meets all qualifications to be a registered voter of the county;
 - 2. Must be able to speak, read, and write the English language;
 - 3. May not hold a public or political party office; and
- 4. May not be a candidate for any public or political party office, a campaign manager for a candidate, or a treasurer for a candidate or political committee.

Note: In most cases, you must be affiliated with one of Maryland's recognized two major political parties. While under oath as an Election Judge, you must remain non-partisan at all times. Remember to work together as a team

ELECTION JUDGE POSITIONS

Chief Judge Provisional Judge Voting Operations Judge Pollbook Same Day Registration Judge

Each Judge works as part of a team including one Democratic Chief Judge and one Republican Chief Judge. Under certain circumstances, a voter registered as "Unaffiliated" may work as a Chief Judge.
