#### Why Awareness Matters: The Impact of Aortic and Heart Valve Disease

Aortic and heart valve diseases are serious, often silent conditions that can lead to life-threatening outcomes if left undiagnosed or untreated. Despite their prevalence, public awareness remains low —making Rock from the Heart's mission more vital than ever.

- Heart valve disease affects more than 11 million people in the United States, with the risk increasing significantly with age. [1]
  - It is estimated that 1 in 10 people over age 75 has moderate to severe heart valve disease, often without symptoms.<sup>[2]</sup>
- Aortic valve disease, including aortic stenosis, impacts over 2.5 million Americans, with up to 7% of adults over 65 affected.<sup>[5]</sup> Without timely intervention, severe aortic stenosis can be fatal within just 2 to 3 years of symptom onset.<sup>[4]</sup>
- Thoracic aortic aneurysms occur in 6 to 10 out of every 100,000 people annually, often progressing silently until a rupture or dissection.<sup>[5]</sup>
- Aortic dissection, a life-threatening emergency, affects approximately 3 to 5 people per 100,000 each year and contributes to an estimated 13,000 deaths annually in the U.S.<sup>[6]</sup>

These statistics highlight the urgent need for education, early detection, and support. Rock from the Heart exists to meet that need—amplifying awareness, empowering patients and families, and driving life-saving conversations. Your support helps us reach more people, share more stories, and save more lives.

#### Awareness is key to survival. Rock from the Heart events help bring the condition to the forefront.

Rock from the Heart envisions a future where individuals are empowered with the knowledge and resources to take control of their heart health, leading to a world with fewer undiagnosed aortic disease cases and related complications. Over the next five years, we aim to:

- Increase awareness: We will work tirelessly to raise awareness of aortic disease and its risk
  factors (family history, high blood pressure, bicuspid aortic valve), emphasizing that in most
  cases, aortic disease is asymptomatic and is underdiagnosed, with most cases diagnosed
  incidentally when the patient undegoes a scan for other medical conditions.
- Expand our reach: Our goal is to reach a wider audience, including those in underserved communities, by partnering with organizations and increasing our online presence.
- Develop new educational resources: We will continue to develop innovative resources that educate individuals about aortic disease diagnosis, management, and recovery, including workshops, webinars, podcasts, and online education.
- Foster partnerships: We will foster collaborations with healthcare providers, community organizations, and corporations to create impactful programs that promote aortic health education.

# **Community Heart Screening**

#### Community Heart Screening: Accessible Care, Life-Saving Impact

In 2025, Rock from the Heart proudly launched its first free community heart screening event, delivering critical preventive care directly to those who need it most. With generous support from GE HealthCare, who donated the use of their Vivid iq portable echocardiography system, and the dedication of volunteer healthcare professionals, we were able to provide echocardiograms and blood pressure checks to community members at no cost.

This event focused on identifying early signs of aortic and heart valve disease —conditions that often go undetected until it's too late. For participants in whom abnormalities were found, follow-up evaluations with a cardiologist were arranged, ensuring continuity of care and a path to timely diagnosis and treatment.

This initiative exemplifies our mission in action: saving lives through awareness, education, and direct community support. Thanks to our partners and volunteers, we're making a real difference—one heartbeat at a time.

#### **Expanding Impact Through On-Demand Education**

To extend the reach of our mission beyond in-person events, Rock from the Heart records all Aortic Ed sessions and makes them available on our YouTube channel. 


