## Undershepherd Udderings





## Highlands Church Annual Car Show

The Highlands GMC Church Annual Charity Car Show will be taking place this year on September 20.

Because of the very wonderful and generous physical, monetary and moral support from the Highlands Church congregation over the past seven years, along with contributions from corporate, retail and individual sponsors, this event has raised, and distributed, over \$100,000 to the three charities it supports.

**Samaritan's Feet** - shares a message of hope and love through washing the feet of children and providing a free new pair of socks and shoes for back-to-school for nearly 200 Gravette students each year.

**Snack Packs for Kids** - furnishes food packs for around 135 food insecure Gravette students to take home each Friday during the school year.

**Bright Futures** - helps meet the needs of Gravette students by helping families with emergency expenses, school supplies, clothing, emergency dental and medication expense and many other basic needs.

We will have volunteer sign-up sheets and online sign-up available mid-August and expect to have car show T-shirts available for order about that same time. Car Show lunch tickets will also be sent out to the congregation about mid-August and more information will be provided on those closer to that date.

In 2024 we had an estimated 600 spectators and 175+ vehicles – (cars, trucks, motorcycles, hot rods and others) which made for a truly great show. One of the best ways of promoting the show is by word of mouth so please let your friends and neighbors know about the show when you can and if you know of anyone with an interesting vehicle, or just see one somewhere, please let them know about the show and ask them to consider participating (show flyers are available on the information counter and our website <a href="https://www.hgmcbv/car-show">www.hgmcbv/car-show</a> has a lot of information on it as well).

The show is free for both spectators and participants and it runs from 10 - 2 with lunch served from 10:30 - 1:30. We will once again have the bounce house and other activities for the kids. Bella Vista Strings will be providing live music again this year and if you've never heard them, you are missing out, they always put on a great show!

#### Financial Notes

Thank you for your generosity! For the first time in years, we are not looking at a "summer slump" in giving or attendance. (Please refer to the budget accounting on page 8). At the printing of this newsletter, we are \$16,400 ahead of expenses for the year. There is a spirit of joy and renewal as we gather each weekend for worship. Highlands Church is the place to be!!

Another exciting bit of news is about our mortgage loan. Originating in January 2011 in the amount of \$1,400,000 for the costs of building the Office/Classroom wing, we have faithfully made monthly payments which were a very heavy portion of our operating budget. However, with



the special giving for "Fifth Sundays Loan Reduction" and many, many special donations to principle payments, we have reduced the balance to \$97,190 as for this date. This extra giving has saved us thousands of dollars in interest over the years and shortened the length of the loan.

**August 31 is the next "Fifth Sunday for Loan Reduction."** If we all give a little extra toward loan reduction that Sunday, we can watch the loan balance go down, down!
