

In case you are not already aware, Highlands Church has a small group of volunteers known as the Outreach Missions Ministry. Sometimes referred to as "Outreach" or "Missions", this committee is being led by Steve Terry this next year.

The purpose of this committee is to represent the church membership commitment with our prayers, presence, gifts, service and witness. Making sure local children and youth needs are met, the region's hungry are fed and addressing emergency relief needs as they arise is the focus of the committee.

In 2018 the committee has provided financial support to the following:

- Snack Packs for Kids (through Samaritans Community Center Rogers) \$9,000 (\$4,500 from the car show proceeds)
- Bright Futures Gravette \$4,000 (\$3,500 from the car show proceeds)
- Samaritan's Feet \$3,189
- NWA Food Bank \$2,000
- Salvation Army \$1,000
- Oasis \$1,000
- Alabama / West Florida UMC Conference Disaster Fund \$1,000
- Total for 2018 = \$21,189

Additional 2018 car show proceeds will be going to Samaritan's Feet (\$2,000) and Bright Futures (\$1,879) in 2019.

Money for the financial gifts is being raised with three church fundraising activities; 1) The car show, 2) the cookie walk and 3) the "Power of One" weekly donations. This year the committee started out with a significant carry-over balance due to concerns about future funding without a Homes Tour. Going forward the committee intends to put our funds to work and have faith that the membership will continue to support our fundraisers. The car show raised just under \$12,000 this past year and we hope to improve on that this year. The Cookie Walk typically raises about \$4,000 for Outreach. Then there is the Power of One - simply folding a bill lengthwise and putting it in the collection plate raised over \$4,000 this past year.

The Outreach committee represents this Church membership. You are supporting Outreach Missions when you help with any of the activities, when you support and attend the Cookie Walk or the Car Show AND when you fold that one (or five or ten or twenty or...) dollar bill and put it in the collection plate. These are all volunteer activities. You are welcome and encouraged to participate!
