

Ask The Church: What is UMCOR?

The Methodist Committee on Relief was created by the Methodist Church in 1940 in response to refugee needs arising from World War II. What began as a temporary relief program became a permanent part of The United Methodist Church in 1972. Renamed the United Methodist Committee on Relief (UMCOR), since that time it has remained a unit of the General Board of Global Ministries.

Today, UMCOR supports work in more than 80 countries, with a direct presence through UMCOR NGO in nine of those countries. UMCOR's work includes programs and projects in disaster response, health, sustainable agriculture, food security, relief supplies, and more.

Then the eleven disciples went to Galilee, to the mountain where Jesus had told them to go. When they saw him, they worshiped him; but some doubted. Then Jesus came to them and said, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age." Matthew 28:16-20

One of our top priorities as Christians needs to be achieving the level of the Christian faith where we can help other people to grow. Just as people have helped us in our Christian walk, so too must we help others to grow in their faith and knowledge of God. Yes, it can sometimes be a struggle to pray and study, but we are not just doing those things for ourselves. We are not growing just so that we can say that we are great spiritually and full of knowledge of God. We grow in the faith in order to help bring other people into the faith and disciple them. This entire faith journey is not about us, it's about Christ. You don't have to have a PhD in Theology or the New Testament to disciple people. What you need is a relationship with Jesus Christ, the discipline to learn, a teachable attitude, and a love for helping others. Those things are all achievable for everyone.

Look around in your life right now. Who needs to know Jesus? Who needs to know more about Jesus? And how can you help? It can be scary to reach out to other people and work with them to grow in the faith, but believe that the Holy Spirit will empower you. Don't let fear stop you from helping someone by changing his or her life through Jesus. Don't hold your knowledge inside, but be zealous to help those who need to know the love of God. Discipling others helps us to grow. It is taking on responsibility for others in our church community. When we disciple people we realize how dependent we are upon God, how much we have to learn, and we are pushed to grow more and more in order to help more and more. A Christian never reaches their full potential or fulfills the commission Jesus gave us until they begin to disciple other people.

This month, think about a few things: 1) Who can disciple you? Reach out to someone and establish a relationship where you have someone discipling you. 2) Make a list of people who you could disciple. Seek to establish a relationship with one of those people so that you can help them in their Christian faith.


Let us continue working together throughout this year and many years to come giving Highlands Church the spirit of leadership in our community.

Centered in Prayer

John Wesley helped us to understand Grace by naming three aspects of Grace. First, there was a time in our faith journeys where we were not aware of the love of God. During this time, God watched over us with prevenient grace—the grace of God that arrives before we are even conscious of it. Secondly, comes justifying grace-it comes when we realize we believe-the moment we first open our eyes to God's reality because of Jesus' teachings. Third, the rest of the journey is Sanctification-or as Paul would identify it, our salvation coming "nearer". Once we are awake to God's loving grace, we cannot go back to sleep. We cannot pretend that it does not exist or push the pause button while we have our good time. Our heart has been transformed to such a degree that we have no desire except to draw closer to God by believing and living the teachings of Jesus Christ.
