The week of Easter, Holy Week, will be here this month. On Good Friday, we worship with the Stations of the Cross. Stations of the Cross has been celebrated over the years through reflecting on 14 different parts of Jesus' last day represented in various paintings or other forms of art.

There are a number of Christian denominations that use this method of worship during Lent such as the Catholics, Lutherans, Anglicans, Presbyterians, and others. There are a number of different versions of The Stations of the Cross, but they all end with Jesus being placed in a tomb. The version of The Stations of the Cross that we use is a retelling of the scriptural accounts of Jesus' death on that Friday so long ago.

Traditionally, The Stations of the Cross involves walking to station after station which would be in a church. However, we do things differently. The way we do it is we show an image on the screen in the Sanctuary, read the Scripture, and pray. I like to use The Stations of the Cross on Good Friday because I think it is important that we focus on the death of Christ that Friday. The best way to focus on the death of Christ and connect with His suffering is to pray in response to the Scriptural accounts of His death. I believe this to be such an important worship service because if we do not think and pray about the death of Christ, then we would deprive ourselves of more knowledge of the length and depth of God's great love for us. We say that "Jesus died for our sins," but do we ever really think about that death? It is easy to skip to Easter and ignore Holy Week and Good Friday, but that is an incomplete experience. I can tell you that year after year, when I remember Good Friday, Easter is that much more powerful.

I hope you'll join us this year on April 19 in the Sanctuary at 6:00 p.m.

#### **SALVATION ARMY**

The Salvation Army awarded Highlands Church with a plaque, in the Red Kettle Group Award category, for the 2018 Top Group Ringers in Washington and Benton Counties. A big THANK YOU to all who rang bells at Allen's Food Market.

During 2018 our area Salvation Army provided individuals and families with 156,073 meals and 31,987 nights of shelter. Altogether, 5,383 individuals were served to meet human needs, 268 utilities were paid to those who needed assistance, and 121 people transitioned to permanent housing and were helped to get back on their feet. 20 men graduated from the Salvation Army's addiction program and are on their way to recovery.


