The Gospel and the Discipline of Bible Intake

Have you considered the significance of the daily saturation in Scripture for developing a more gospel-centered, Christ-focused life?

Preach the Gospel to Yourself Every Day

Martin Luther encouraged Christians: "preach the gospel to yourself every day." So there are times in every day when we need the reminder that what we are doing, saying, or thinking is sinful and needs to be taken by repentance to the cross of Jesus for forgiveness.

Reading the Bible was never intended to be the primary means of absorbing the Bible. Reading is the exposure to Scripture — and that's the starting place. Meditation is the absorption of Scripture. And it is this that leads to the experiences with God and the changes in our lives we seek when we come to the Bible.

Most Christians read the Bible. Few meditate on it. As a result, so many sense little spiritual impact from the time they invest in Scripture intake. So the main reason more Christians don't find their daily time in the Scriptures more profitable has little to do with the strength of their memory, the level of their education, or their IQ. Rather, the problem is very simple: a lack of meditation on Scripture.

If you spend just 60 seconds meditating on a verse of Scripture, do you realize that may be ten to twenty times as long as you would normally consider that verse? Reserve at least a minute in your Bible reading time today, choose a verse and ask: How does this relate to the gospel and to Jesus? What would the application of this verse look like in my life? Why did the Holy Spirit include this passage in the book? What is He intending to communicate through this text?

FINANCES- THE NEXT STEP

After five months of membership giving, the following shows a review of how money comes to the church monthly. Note the irregularity of the amount. This does not include non-member giving or other income, this is member giving only.

January \$34,501, February \$51,129, March \$38,537, April \$32,693, May \$46,364

This represents 151 giving units of which only 20% are given by ACH transfer from their bank or other financial institution. 20% of 151 equals 31 giving units at Highlands Church using automatic payments.

ACH payments take the guesswork out of what we will receive monthly to obtain an even flow of money to meet our obligations. When the cash flow is interrupted, reserve money needs to be moved to meet payment of obligations.

If you would please consider ACH transfer from your bank to Highlands Church, please call Dru Matthews, Treasurer or Donna Hagaman, Financial Secretary. You will need to give them an account number- 'Transaction Completed.' Or you may complete a form in the church office anytime.

Using this ACH method helps our cash flow tremendously. When you are out of town your contribution still moves forward. Another advantage is it eliminates writing checks or having the right amount of cash on hand. Should you need to make a change in your contribution, just call Dru or Donna and they will handle your request.

Again, I thank you for your support to your church and, if possible, please consider this request and please continue to pray for Highlands Church and all its members as we move forward in making disciples for Jesus Christ in this community.


SNACK PACKS

Did you know 1 out of every 5 children in Northwest Arkansas face hunger or food insecurity? Hunger affects 26,000 children in our four-county community! Samaritan Community Center is in its 15th year of operation. Their SnackPacks for kids program provides weekend nutritional support to 6,000 children in 166 schools. Since 2004 Samaritan has delivered 2.1 million snackpacks at a cost of over \$5.5 million.
