3 Steps to Remind Yourself of His Faithfulness

In the midst of hardship, tragedy, and unanswered questions, it's difficult to glimpse God at work. How do we hold onto our faith during these times? How do we trust God is working all things for our good and His glory?

Grab your journal, and take these three steps to remind yourself of God's faithfulness:

1. Write out the date and what's going on to cause you to feel fearful. The Bible says, *"Cast all your anxiety on him because he cares for you."* 1 Peter 5:7 For example, a doctor's visit.
2. Next, write out a Bible verse or several, next to your fear to give you hope. If I use the doctor's visit as an example here, a powerful verse is, *"Your faithfulness continues through all generations; you established the earth, and it endures."*

3. Now the hard part: Leave the third step blank. Believe in faith that God *will* answer your prayer ... but trust it'll happen in His time. And when He does answer it, come back and write it here with a bold red pen! Writing out faith-filled verses, along with your answers to prayer, is the simplest of ways to rehearse God's faithfulness to you, too!

When we remind our forgetful hearts and minds how much God has proven His care for us, a bold trust builds. We can see how God has worked good into our lives and in the lives of others *before*, and we can fully trust He wants to do it again! Remind your heart: What you're facing is a challenge. It isn't defeat, but challenges in life are an opportunity for God to show His faithfulness. I'm ready to see it again. Aren't you?

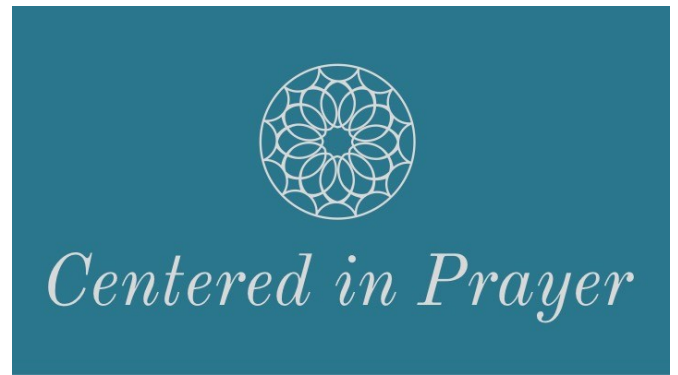

Read Luke 11:5-13.


Prayer changes things. We respond as the disciples, "Lord, teach us to pray", but we continue to doubt whether God hears or cares about our prayers. After giving the disciples a model for prayer, Jesus then gives an illustration to emphasize

His teaching and to reassure us that God not only hears but cares and responds.

Prayer is not a superstitious recitation or a blank check to fulfill our wishes. Prayer does not guarantee financial prosperity. Prayer is a discipline. Prayer is asking, seeking, knocking, and waiting. And God, the perfect parent, hears and responds.

Prayer is spending time with God. We can talk with God about relationships within our community, about needs of others, and about ourselves. Sometimes, life overwhelms us and we have no words at all.

Jesus encourages us to pray often and to persevere in our prayers. God is not only high and holy but also close and intimate. God cares more for us than we can comprehend. It’s back to school time and I know there’s so much excitement, but for me it was always my least favorite time of year. I never cared much for school and frankly, I don’t think school ever cared much for me. Growing up, I remember everyone continually telling me I needed to get an education and I never seemed to be able to convince them that I didn’t. In fact, I was a bit of a Puritan, because I really only saw the religion class at my Christian school as necessary education. And while that might be strange to think at such a young age, here I am now.

When I went to a public high school, we didn’t have religion class so as you can imagine, I really didn’t see a point in being there. I went so far as to try and drop out of high school. My parents thought when I said that I was dropping out that I was joking with them or trying to rebel and irritate them. They soon found out I wasn’t joking when my principal informed my mother that I had indeed tried to drop out and that he wasn’t going to sign the paperwork. After a long talk with my parents (mostly me listening) it seemed a lot easier to go along with the program, but that didn’t mean I had to like it. When I got out of high school my plan was to drag my feet in college long enough to frustrate my parents into getting their blessing to drop out. That didn’t work out either. After all the complaining and class skipping that I did, I figured my grade point average would be too low to get into a seminary graduate program, but much to my surprise, annoyance, and relief, my GPA was actually good.

When I sat down with my advisor in seminary I noticed that all they offered were classes I wanted to take which led to a strangely fast and smooth path to graduation. I actually kind of wanted to stay longer.

Why am I sharing this with you? Because to me, all of what you just read is a profound story. It’s a story of rebellion, not thinking things through, and being just plain stubborn. I look back on my life and all that I tried to throw away and I realize there was only one factor that got me through. God. I can’t justify it any other way. Sure I had supportive parents. Sure I had a lot of great things in place, but I tried to undo all the good things that I had been given to get my own way. It really was only God that got me through. It really was only God that held everything together and got me to the other side.

So what’s your story? What’s your version of school? What are the events in your life that you look at and realize that it was only God that got you through? Knowing and being able to verbalize those periods of time are more important than you might think, because those stories become the stories that give muscle and bone to confidence in God. Those stories give courage and allow trust.

There are countless events in my life where I didn’t feel like God was anywhere around at the time, but as I look back on those stories I realize that there wasn’t anywhere in them that God wasn’t present. I would encourage you to start writing out those tales of times when God got you through or at least rehearse them in your mind. Reflect on them as much as you can, because by recognizing and affirming God’s faithfulness in the past, we become much less scared of the future.
