## Highlights of Lent

### **ASH WEDNESDAY SERVICE, February 26, 6:00 pm**

This first day of Lent is the time of reflection and penitence leading up to Easter Sunday. Pastor Robert will remind us “For dust you are and to dust you shall return” (Genesis 3:19) as ashes are imposed on the forehead.

**PALM SUNDAY**—Celebrate the triumphal entry of Jesus into Jerusalem on April 5 at 9:30 am for our Traditional Service or at 11:15 am for our Gathering Service. There will be a Palm Parade for children at the 9:30 am Traditional service.

### **MAUNDY THURSDAY, April 9, 6:00 pm**

“Colors of Grace” will be sung by the Chancel Choir. Each anthem portrays a lesson to be learned from the example of Christ and is visually represented by a colored cloth and appropriate symbol. Our drama group will join the choir in this presentation.

### **GOOD FRIDAY, APRIL 10, 6:00 pm**

The Stations of the Cross Service is a powerful way to contemplate, and enter into, the mystery of Jesus’ gift of Himself to us. # Pastor's Pen



Lent always seems to provide me with a spiritual boost and over the years, I have noticed that other people seem to have the same need to experience Lent that I do. After all, there is a certain beauty in the season because while reflection on Christ's death is so heavy, the anticipation of resurrection helps us bear that weight. This heaviness of the death of Christ, with the lifting up of our souls and the hope of resurrection, seems to create this very workable tension. It is almost as though Lent, for a period of time, redefines the law of gravity and makes a very fertile ground for spiritual growth.

Several months ago, I used the term "thin places". This is an idea in Celtic Christianity that there are places and events in life where Heaven and earth do not seem so separated, where you can sort of reach through earth to Heaven. Lent, at least for me, always seems to be a season of thin places. The cost of finding those thin places is reflection on the death of Christ, and the impermanence of earthly life. In essence, one of our greatest opportunities for spiritual growth and joy comes cloaked in suffering. On Ash Wednesday we are hit with reminders of our own suffering and potential suffering, our death, and the death of those we love. Many people run from Ash Wednesday and Lent altogether, because this holy time takes no prisoners. It is a season of reflection that demands that we come face to face with the things we do not want to come face to face with. Yet, when you look into the suffering and death of Christ you do not find gloom; you find hope. Because in Christ, His glory is forever linked with His suffering. He has forever changed suffering and death by His own suffering and death. So, to look into His suffering is to look into the face of hope, to look into His death is to look into everlasting life.

We have the obligation to, as is stated in our Book of Worship, "keep a holy Lent." Keeping a holy Lent means fasting from something, taking on a spiritual discipline, and the giving of alms. My pastoral advice is to fast from something that actually matters, something that actually makes you reflect on the seriousness of the season and draws you back to that "thin place." I have heard people say things like "oh giving up chocolate is not enough." I believe it is though. Why? Because if you are giving up something you enjoy for Lent you are forced to think about Lent whenever you abstain from it. It is not the size of the sacrifice in the eyes of someone else that matters, it is whether or not that sacrifice is drawing your attention back to the season and ultimately to Christ. For spiritual disciplines I always think anything you can do that marks the times of day is wonderful. An example of that being, if you are in HUMMERS, then read your chapter of the Bible from the reading plan in the morning and read a devotional at night. Morning prayers and evening prayers have traditionally been the way that prayers have been set for Protestants over the last several centuries so finding something to read or pray about in the morning and evening is perfect.

One last request: put our church at the top of your prayer list during Lent, not because there is something wrong, but because there is something right. Pray that we would remember what a refuge this church has been for us and pray that we would have many chances to bring people in from the storms of life to the refuge Christ has given us in these beautiful hills in His Church.
