Pastor's Pen—Holy Communion

I am so thankful for this congregation being understanding and flexible during a time when we have to figure out how to do things in a new way. One of the hardest things about dealing with COVID-19 is trying to navigate through what used to be simple decisions that are now a series of decisions. Celebrating Holy Communion used to be relatively easy. As a church body, we had bread and juice, we prayed and consecrated the bread and juice, and we partook of the bread and juice. Now, between social distancing and the virus, we have to make changes to the way we celebrate Holy Communion.

Beginning this weekend, September 5 & 6, we return to celebrating Communion together on the first weekend of every month. However, the process will be a little different.

If you feel comfortable attending church, then you will receive communion as part of the service. We will still be using the individual packets that contain both the bread and the juice. At the end of each worship service, I will consecrate the elements and take them to a table near the exit. You will be dismissed and as you leave worship, you will be handed that individual packet of elements in a ziplock bag. The bags will be packed and distributed by a church volunteer in gloves and a mask. I know some will ask why we cannot just do this in the Sanctuary or Fellowship Hall but going about it that way would force us all to remove our masks, which would be against state and denominational health advice.

If you do not feel comfortable coming to church yet, or you are an individual at risk, you will still have the opportunity to take Communion through the drive through like we have done before. The drive through service will take place Sunday, September 6 at 4:00 pm under the awning to the Fellowship Hall. You will drive under the awning where I will hand you an individual packet of bread and juice. I will have consecrated these elements prior to this drive through Communion Service.

Remember, we have an open table because it is the Lord's Table, not our own. Any guest who wants to know Christ more is welcome to participate in these options for Holy Communion.

I look forward to celebrating this sacrament with you this weekend.






Attention all Hummers and UMW members!

Guidelines for In-Person Worship at Highlands Church

We advise you to continue to worship via online platforms at home if:

- You have had a fever of 100.4°F or higher in the past 2 days.
- You have cough, shortness of breath, sore throat, new loss of taste or smell or other symptoms typical of virus.
- You have had known exposure to someone with Covid-19 in the past 14 days.
- You have young children who are unable to adhere to physical distancing guidelines.
- You may wish to refrain from entering our building if you are 65 or more years old or have underlying health conditions including high blood pressure, chronic lung disease, diabetes, severe obesity, asthma or immune-compromising conditions, because you are at higher risk for severe illness if infected by Covid-19.

Face masks are required for entrance (except for children under 10 years old) and must be worn at all times.

Centered in Prayer

Romans 8:26,27 In the same way, the spirit helps us in our weakness. We do not know what we ought to pray for, but the Spirit, himself intercedes for us with groans that words cannot express. And he who searches our hearts knows the mind of the Spirit, because the Spirit intercedes for the saints in accordance with God's will.

You are reading the paper or watching TV. You see or read something terrible that lands with an impact. You give a deep sigh; you groan or grieve inside yourself.

Paul tells us that when we groan like that, we may actually be participating in the Spirit's groaning over sin and evil in the world, for the Spirit prays for us in "sighs too deep for words." Or perhaps you're dealing with a really frustrating situation, and you go to bed discouraged but having turned over your situation to God, the next morning you feel renewed resilience, maybe even a new idea. "The Spirit helps us in our weakness," declares Paul.

Paul speaks frankly about the fact that we don't really know how to pray "as we ought." So why pray? Regular prayer, even in our ignorance, can open us to those deeper sighs and yearnings that get buried in our daily busyness.

Prayer serves to put us into the flow of the Spirit, not to find satisfaction for our superficial desires. Prayer is time alone with God, openness to God, a time for relationship, a regular connection. Spirit-life flows from that relationship.

As we bring our gratitude, thanksgiving, honest confession of our needs, and frank assessment of both our mistakes and our successes into the flow, the Spirit can begin to shape our desires for ourselves and the world. God can awaken and stir up yearnings for goodness, justice, humility, courage, patience, self-control, kindness and compassion which are the many faces of Christ.
