Holy Week Activities

Holy Week contains the most painful and glorious events in the life of our Savior, Jesus Christ. Highlands will be having services celebrating the triumphal entry into Jerusalem on Palm Sunday weekend at our regular service times. On Maundy Thursday, April 1, at 6:00 pm in the Sanctuary, we will have a service of reflection, confession and a commemoration of the Last Supper with Holy Communion. On Good Friday, April 2, also at 6:00 pm in the Sanctuary, we will have a service depicting the Stations of the Cross; Jesus' journey to Calvary. We will celebrate the resurrection of Jesus Christ at our Easter Sunday services at 9:30 am in the Sanctuary. As a reminder, the entire Church will be celebrating Easter together on Sunday morning therefore; there will be no Saturday Celebration or Sunday Gathering that weekend.

Pastor's Pen by Rev. Robert Cloninger

I heard a story several years ago from my professor, the Rabbi, about a Rabbi in his death bed a few centuries in the past. The Rabbi in his deathbed was surrounded by people that loved him; he had lived a full life, but there was a hint of sadness. One of his fellow Rabbis asked him what was wrong, to which the Rabbi responded "I will go now to meet God, having lived a wonderful life, but I will not get to study anymore."

The importance of that story is that it tells us there are different ways to experience God. C.S. Lewis even comments on how for some people a prayer book will make them forget how to pray, but exploring a mystery of God in



study will have them praying for hours. Maybe some of you know exactly what I am talking about and you have felt unable to pray or even bored with prayer. The reason, I feel, that people get bored with prayer is because they are not honoring the way God made them. And they are not honoring the way that God made them because they were never given permission.

I want everyone to have a full prayer life, but I do not want everyone thinking that their prayer life has to look the same as somebody else's. A lot more people find prayer lives in study than is ever really talked about.

I remember the time in my life when I just figured I didn't have much of a relationship with God because I was interested in all of the typical forms of prayer. Yet, when I studied I felt like God was sitting across the table from me.

I know I have talked a lot about prayer, but remember, prayer is communication. That is what I am after more than anything; is seeing that God's people are regularly communicating with him. Feel free to do what is right for you, because the deeper you go with it, the more wisdom and insight you will have. And that wisdom and insight extend into all areas of your life, especially your life as a church member.


Finance Office News




HUMC groups can meet inside the church but please call to schedule a classroom with the church office in advance.
