Before the blood drive, please take a few steps to ensure that things go smoothly on the day of our blood drive.

- 1. Drink plenty of water or juice the night and morning before you donate.
- 2. Eat a well-balanced meal around 2-3 hours before giving.
- 3. Bring your photo ID Photo ID is now required for all donors.
- 4. Bring a mask. Masks are currently required at all blood drives. If you do not have one, one will be provided for you.
- 5. Expedite your check-in process by visiting cbco.org the morning of the blood drive and click on the 'Donor QuickPass' to get your paperwork done before you arrive.

Pastor's Pen by Rev. Robert Cloninger

There is a reality in our lives which is that the more things change the more they stay the same. What you see throughout the Bible is the repeated theme that reality has to be changed or trouble is around the corner. The trap we have to watch out for is getting caught up in life and living until the years pass by and we realize we have not grown as Christians. Even during times like Lent, we can start with the best intentions to grow and change and it's not the big things that throw us off that course, it's having to get the day to day things done. And even in such a short time frame as the 40 days of Lent, we can forget about every spiritual goal we started the season with. It happens in our personal lives and it happens in our churches.



This is a teaching that I want to make crystal clear, and certainly

hope I have in the past; that our Christian growth gets derailed most often not by obvious things, but the things we take for granted. We take days for granted until we haven't prayed or read our Bible in years. We take Sundays for granted until it can seem like a chore to keep the Sabbath. We can even take God for granted because "He'll always be there." See! This is a dangerous trap because going with the flow of life, bending here, giving there, can lead to the shattering of all 10 commandments and destroy a flourishing relationship with God.

I believe the remedy lies in Christ's teaching to watch and pray. If we keep watch of every minute, and we pray, we are active and ready to flourish spiritually. We keep relationships. We feel like we have enough. We feel like we are loved. This cannot occur in the fast lane of life. If we are looking to just get the day over, then we are choosing a path of pain. And if we cannot find contentment with a simple life of holy living we will create suffering and heartache.

"Jesus Paid it All" was written in the choir loft of a Methodist church and beautifully tells us what we need to do, echoing the words of Christ: "Child of weakness, watch and pray find in Me (Jesus) your all in all."


