

4th Annual Highlands Cruise-In & Car Show

Meal tickets to be purchased, sold or returned, have been mailed out for the Highlands Church 4th annual Cruise-In & Car Show fundraiser to support Bright Futures, Snack Packs for Kids and Samaritan's Feet for Gravette School District children. Nearly half of the money we raise from the car show comes from congregational sales of these meal tickets in addition to day-of-the-show sales and donations.

Money from ticket sales and/or unsold tickets may be placed in the marked collection box in the envelopes in which the tickets were provided. The collection box will be available when attending any of the weekend services or can be found in front of the Church office during the week. Returning unsold tickets is appreciated since they may be used for sales during the show.

Volunteers are needed for the day of the show. We will need help greeting and parking people displaying their vehicle; facilitating spectator parking - including transporting spectators from our back parking lot and the Village Baptist Church lot across the street to the main HUMC lot; preparing and serving the lunch; selling meal tickets at the show and monitoring show activities. Volunteer meetings to review responsibilities and assignments will be noted in the church Weekly Update email and service announcements.

The Show will be conducted much like last year; activities, including lunch service, will be conducted outside. However, we do plan to have the Fellowship Hall and Gathering Area available for relaxation.

I have been giving something a lot of thought for a while now. It goes without saying that one of my passions in the ministry is encouraging others to walk the daily walk, particularly through time spent with God via prayer and Bible study. However, there are many other ways to supplement these two areas to increase one's spiritual life. I have worked with my own spiritual directors and have come to learn that various methods and disciplines are good, but for me, life changes. And it changes often. I have spent two decades reading books and learning from various teachers on this topic. The entire catalog of the human experience is dealt with, for most people, by the time they bid the world goodbye. With that being said, I want to practice what I preach and



equip people to live their lives in step with God. This isn't always easy, nor is it best done alone. Therefore, starting immediately, I would like to open up several hours per week to meet with whomever might need spiritual direction.

This is not a counseling situation, nor is it a situation that only people going through hard times should engage in. Instead, this is to help you draw closer to God in your daily life. There are several situations I can think of where you might want to work with me. One of those is simply, "Where do I start? What do I do?". I can help you with that. Another situation might be grief, anger and even disinterest in the spiritual life altogether. I can help in those places as well.

All you have to do is email me or contact the church office and set up an appointment. We can review your current spiritual life, make some goals, and chart out a plan to get you to those goals. I will be teaching more Bible studies, but I would like this opportunity to get to work and study with those interested in one-on-one spiritual guidance.




Help make a difference in YOUR community by giving blood!

Appointments are strongly encouraged to manage donor flow. To schedule an appointment time, visit our website, call the church office, or contact our coordinator, Gene Leonard at 479-381-1039.

Before the blood drive, please take a few steps to ensure that things go smoothly on the day of our blood drive.

- 1. Drink plenty of water or juice the night and morning before you donate.
- 2. Eat a well-balanced meal around 2-3 hours before giving.
- 3. Bring your photo ID Photo ID is now required for all donors.
- 4. Bring a mask. Masks are currently required at all blood drives. If you do not have one, one will be provided for you.
- 5. Expedite your check-in process by visiting cbco.org the morning of the blood drive and click on the 'Donor QuickPass' to get your paperwork done before you arrive.
