**3.** Vehicle I would most like to drive off-road Serenity Howard: 1977 Ford Bronco - Bob Johnson, owner


**4.** Vehicle I would most like to have as my everyday transportation Harrison Reed: 2004 Chevrolet Silverado - Mike Pulhamus, owner


