I asked my friend, Nat Collis, to teach our Tuesday Bible Study because I needed to go to my children's preschool for "Super Daddy Night." Super Daddy Night is for dads and their kids to celebrate that bond fathers and children have. Nat said, "of course," and something to the effect of "enjoy these times." I'm certainly sorry if I butchered that, Nat. He gives great advice and the truth is I have every intention of enjoying these times. In fact, I'm trying to enjoy the childhood of Caroline and Bobby in the great times and even in the times they're sick. They won't, as many wise people have said, be little forever. I can't say I'm perfect, but I can say that I'm cognizant of the fact that my children won't be young and at home with me forever and that every single moment should be enjoyed.



We choose how we experience life. I'm convinced of that. No matter who or what has shaped some of our outlooks and attitudes it is still our choice to apply the lens or lenses we have to our life. In fact, I think one of the greatest examples of this is when Jesus celebrates His last Passover with his disciples. He has come into the world with his future shaped by God and this future includes the crucifixion He is about to endure. He knows He is about to die and doesn't want to. He knows He will be betrayed and denied. All of this knowledge is real to Him as He sits at the table and has the Passover feast with His disciples. In that moment He chose not to panic and not to run away and hide. He chose not to fret, but instead He chooses to enjoy the meal and teach. I'm not sure I could have done the same with a future like that in front of me.

But a key takeaway in what Jesus is doing is that He knows of the resurrection and He knows that His death his temporary. Therefore He can rejoice. You see, Jesus has done something for us; He's died for us to remove the prospect of death from our lives so that we might truly live until our last earthly breath. And that's what He wants. He wants that we should live until our last earthly breath, not fearing death. So, live to the fullest for what is to be feared has been dealt with and our lives have been laid open to fully embrace and enjoy.


