On Easter morning, enjoy a continental breakfast before services from 8:30—9:15 or 10:30—11:00. As a reminder, the entire Church will be celebrating Easter together on Sunday morning (2 services) therefore; there will be no Celebration Service on Saturday, April 16.

When I was growing up my dad bought an Oldsmobile 442. Not one of the big time muscle cars, but a small release of more daily driver friendly models. It was special to my dad; my grandfather sold it to him off the lot he worked for and it was a less powerful version of one of his dream cars. However, that dream became a nightmare.

We can start the problem list with the tickets. The car may have been geared to those looking for a fun daily driver, but that doesn't mean the car didn't dare you to ignore speed limits. I remember distinctly hearing that famous question from two state troopers talking to my dad: "do you have any idea how fast you were going?" To be candid though, we both knew how fast my dad was going and they were great bonding experiences. The second problem was that the trim and adornments around the internal door handles came off quickly, leading to arguments about me tearing up door handles. However, my dad ripped his whole door handle off by accident and finally confessed there was a problem. The third problem was my dad got his license plates stolen twice,



along with four car stereos. That's not the car's fault, but we lived in a rough neighborhood and didn't have a garage.

The final straw in the 442 debacle was spilt milk. Whoever coined the phrase "there's no use crying over spilt milk", clearly had no sense. Dad had a gallon of milk bust in his trunk when he was going too fast on the way home from the grocery store one night... in the summer. Anyone who rode in that car cried over spilt milk. They probably also got nauseous and vowed to never ride in that car again. Poor dad, no matter how hard he tried, he could not get rid of that smell.

Dad got fed up and he finally went to the lot to get a Cutlass that drew less attention and was easier to clean.

The moral of the story isn't to give up on dreams. The car wasn't even expensive, since it was a version of a version of a 442, so the point isn't not to buy expensive things. The point isn't to park in a garage. No it's none of those things. The point is to have fun in all of the messiness of life. Because that's what life is; it's messy. But it's beautiful.

See, one of the things about the Christian faith for me is that Jesus came, God in the flesh, in the midst of a mess. Sure, there was the mess of good and evil. Jesus conquered evil. But it's also the fact that Jesus stepped into the mess of everything we're born into and he made something out of it. He made friends, had great relationships, brought truth. He brought levity when he'd walk past people who said they were going to stone him or when he knelt down to draw in the sand when the woman caught in adultery was being accused. He embraced life on every level, and we remember him for the big things and the day-to-day things he did in the messiness of life.

For what it's worth, I think Jesus would have liked that 442.
