Highlands Church Cruise-In & Car Show









We have started our Sponsor / Donor drive for this year's -5^{th} Annual - Cruise-In and Car Show! We are always looking for more individuals and businesses who would like to support these charities by sponsoring or donating to our event.

Flea & Boutique Thank You


