I have some exciting news. I would like everyone who can be in attendance to come to Traditional Worship on Sunday, July 10. During that service, we will be confirming five students who have worked hard in the Confirmation process and deserve our support.

For those that don't know what Confirmation is, it is the time when young adults publicly profess their faith in front of the congregation and take the vows to become members of the congregation and support it. Each of these Confirmands had to undergo a rigorous educational process. And we cannot forget their families who have raised them in the faith, set an example, and kept them involved in church to get to this point.



The students have had to work through six weeks of curriculum and spiritual formation with me. There are parts of the education process that are interesting, but not all of it. As I told them, "some of this we just have to get through to learn." But they never complained. We got through education what a profession of faith means. And we also looked at topics like the Trinity. There was education in the history of Christianity and how individual United Methodist Congregations work. And on top of that we discuss where we are different from other denominations and our place in the timeline of events that is the Christian story. Most of all, we tried to get all of their questions answered. The students have all made it through with flying colors and are ready to go before the congregation.

Let us take a more in-depth look at what this process means. It means the Confirmands are making profession of faith in addition to making a profession of commitment to this church. The intense curriculum has led them through an education of local church function, committee function, theology, and a thorough acquaintance with the Book of Discipline. Part of going through the process of going through Confirmation is coming to the understanding that they are responsible for the church too.

I hope you will join us to watch this major event in the life of the church and in the lives of the Confirmands and their families. Further, I hope you will be in prayer now, and continue to be in prayer for these students and their life in the church and community.



Before the blood drive, please take a few steps to ensure that things go smoothly on the day of our blood drive.

- 1. Drink plenty of water or juice the night and morning before you donate.
- 2. Eat a well-balanced meal around 2-3 hours before giving.
- 3. Bring your photo ID Photo ID is now required for all donors.
- 4. Expedite your check-in process by visiting cbco.org the morning of the blood drive and click on the 'Donor QuickPass' to get your paperwork done before you arrive.

These operational team members would need some simple tools and flexibility with their time, of which, not much is typically required.

HUMC Library


If you are not familiar with the Church Library, allow me to introduce it to you!

After registering online, the coordinator will email you to see what hours you want to volunteer that day. You do NOT have to work the entire 8-4 day. The actual distribution is 11a -3p, but they will also be looking for volunteers to assist with setup and teardown. For an alternative way to sign up, visit the Information Station where you will find a form to fill out where you can indicate your preference of afternoon or morning shift. Leave your completed form in the basket on the Information Station and the coordinator will enter your information. You will receive a confirmation email that your signup is complete. We hope you will make plans to attend!
