Pastor's Pen by Rev. Robert Cloninger

Later this month, I will be going on a week-long spiritual retreat. I bring this topic up because I think it is important to go into some explanation about my own religious life to encourage others. People hear the word retreat and think that it means relaxing by the beach or sitting in a cabin in the woods watching lots of TV, thus retreating from the world. That is not the kind of retreat I will be doing. In fact, the type of retreat I am going on in many ways, frightens me because of the intense self-reflection and prayer involved. I'll be spending the week going through the Exercises of St. Ignatius of Loyola. This style of retreat has happened for centuries and has consistently changed lives. I have personally wanted to do this retreat for years, but have not found the time to do it.



St. Ignatius was initially a soldier, and his method of spirituality was as intense and regulated as military life. There are certain days for certain reflections. There will be long meetings with a spiritual director and at least five hours in prayer a day. In short, the retreat is a thorough bootcamp that works intensely in a short amount of time.

The importance of this retreat for me is that I feel spiritually exhausted and a bit stale. I read the Bible, I pray, and I have devotional reading, but something has been missing for a while now. Honestly, I am not even sure what that something is, but I do know that it has a lot to do with silence. I love being a pastor, a husband, and a father, and yet I am keenly aware that to do all of those things I have to give up some silence and stillness. I have never mastered the balance of being able to find silence and listen to God deeply while being in the world, so the best plan for me is to take this time to get out of the world for a while to find that silence and spend some time listening.

The reason I feel the importance of this retreat now is that I am keenly aware that the world is shifting and changing so quickly. I must bump up my spiritual life to be the type of leader, father, and husband that I want to be and that God has called me to be. To get that bump, it's going to take more dedication in a new way and I am ready to learn and further commit.

We are all called to this life of being in the world. We also have to be ready with new ideas and a heart of love to carry out the Gospel of Jesus Christ. Sometimes that means we have to do new things to grow and learn. I would urge you to always push yourself to grow spiritually, no matter the level of discomfort. It will ultimately create greater joy in your life and help others.

Hopefully I will have lots of stories for you, and you will notice a difference in me soon.
