Pastor's Pen by Rev. Robert Cloninger

Saint Francis of Assisi was the person that had the idea for the Nativity scenes that we still use today. Saint Francis excelled in simplifying the profound concepts. What is more profound than the Nativity? It is the very birth of Jesus Christ complete with two of the best people that have ever lived (Mary and Joseph), and angels. Saint Francis knew that People love symbols, signs and art. Think about stained-glass windows, and how they have been used to teach through images over the centuries.

Personally, I am a huge fan of the Chrismon tree. I love looking at the different symbols representing the reign of Christ throughout history. And just think of the Advent wreath; it's been constant for so long that we cannot imagine the Christmas Season without it. Christmas, with all the symbols and art, was not put together overnight or by accident. We are supposed to be learning lessons all along the way and hopefully the combination of art, symbols, songs, and Scriptures completely overwhelms us with joy.



What I find so important about keeping Christ central in Christmas is that in doing so I always have a "traditional Christmas." When I look to Christ as the center and let myself get caught up in the Advent Wreath, the Chrismon Tree, the Scriptures, and the Nativity Scene, I find that I always have a Christmas that fulfills the need for nostalgia. And I believe this to be a great gift and highly important to our joy.

Christmas always falls on December 25, but life still keeps moving. Sometimes people are in the hospital on that day. Sometimes we are sick on that day. Sometimes we have experienced tragedy during the time around Christmas. And sometimes we experience something great. All of these things change the ways we celebrate Christmas. If we are not careful, we can feel a huge sense of loss when life gets in the way of December 25.

I have had to learn to be flexible during Christmas. Things, for some reason, come up a lot in my life during that time. And it must be a family thing because I remember my parents talked about celebrating Christmas at Pizza Hut because my grandfather was in the hospital. I had one of the greatest joys in my life during Christmas one year when I brought home my daughter, Caroline, on December 24 and started learning to live with a newborn. So many times we do not get to have that "normal" and "traditional" Christmas, but that is okay. Mary and Joseph got a big surprise too.

What I have learned is that when people feel like "Christmas isn't Christmas," what they really want is the routine and stability of the routine. That's why getting and staying centered on Christ is so important. You will always have a joyful and stable (pun intended) Christmas when Christ is the center. You will always feel a Christmas warmth when you are focused on the things of God. The presents and food are not important; Christ's birth is. Hold fast to Christ and to the traditions of the Christian faith, and you will find everything you are supposed to this Christmas season.
