Missions Ministry Report

Thank you church family for volunteering your time in 2022 at Care and Share Thrift Store in Gravette, Samaritan's Feet Shoe Event in Gravette, Samaritan Community Center in Rogers packing snack packs for food insecure students in the Gravette School District, and ringing the bell for the Salvation Army Red Kettle Campaign. Your time and servant's heart have made a great impact on families in our area. We began 2022 with \$16,399.41 in the Car Show fund, \$1,254.69 in the Power of One fund and \$6,714.23 in the Other Mission fund. During the year we received \$2,392 in the Power of One and \$700 in Other Mission. We had a total of \$27,460.33 in the Missions Ministry for 2022 and we disbursed \$27,300 to the following:

Snack Packs for Gravette Schools \$14,300 (FYI snack packs cost \$3 ea) Bright Futures Gravette \$6,000 Samaritan's Feet \$4,000 (200 shoes @\$20/pair) NWA Food Bank \$3,000

In 2023, please continue to donate to Power of One. Simply fold any size bill lengthwise and place in the offering plate. Those bills are directed to Missions.

A big thank you to the Car Show team and everyone who helped make that a successful fund raiser. We raised \$17,163.80 from the Car Show in 2022 to be distributed in 2023.
