One of the daily tasks and pleasures of a Christian is to maintain a positive mindset. Of course this can be difficult, but it is an imperative piece of our faith. Things in life do come up. Sadness, despair, grief, and anxiety all make appearances, but the response is to meet all of your feelings with a positive outlook. This is not "faking it, till you make it," nor is it some juvenile, and simplistic version of positivity. What I am describing here is letting the reality of your salvation inform your reality in full. If you can daily see who you are to God and what your future is, you can find a positive outlook. The sadness of life comes and goes. The down times come and they go. What's forever is victory and joy. This mindset needs to be practiced though. God will by Spirit and



grace help you in this journey, but this is a daily discipline. The easiest thing will be to look past the positive and straight to the negative and at times your temptation to do so will be overwhelming. Do not take the bait and give in to pessimism.

To put this into perspective a little more, we have to explore what the positive outlook does. It first affirms the Scriptures. It secondly, though, allows us to claim victory over the waves of despair we can find ourselves in. If we cannot walk in positivity then how can we claim that Christ's victory is true? How can we claim that death's sting has been destroyed? We can't. We can't claim that the sorrows of life have been destroyed in one breath and be pessimistic about the little things that make up our day to day.

Sure, there are lots of Christians who walk around with a pessimistic attitude failing to claim the fullness of faith in Jesus Christ and marinating in the misery that they have allowed to overcome them. However, you do not have to be one of those people. You can allow joy to fill your life and trust. And that attitude attracts others to Jesus Christ.

If you want to be positive, it's simply a matter of practice. For 21 days, enough to build a habit, focus on the promises of God and refuse to give into pessimism. Before the time is up, you will have already made the switch to a more positive life. The reason that we don't talk about this that much is because I believe a lot of us think life should be hard and we should, because of our good Puritanical roots, suffer until we get to heaven. What nobody told modern America about the Puritans though, is that one of the things they were known for was their joy. They had every hope in heaven and on earth and were delighted by it. Enjoy your walk with Jesus, and others will start walking with you.

The 2nd Grilk Lecture Series to feature Prof. Jeremy Hyman of the University of Arkansas.



Professor Jeremy Hyman will be the next guest lecturer in the Ernest W. Grilk Bible Lecture Series. His lecture will take place at Highlands Church on March 5 at 3:00 pm in the Fellowship Hall. Professor Hyman is a lecturer in philosophy at the University of Arkansas, Fayetteville. His primary area of research is the 17th century French philosopher, Rene Descartes, specifically the emergence of Cartesian metaphysics as an alternative to the then-prevailing medieval Aristotelian world view. In addition, Mr. Hyman has taught Biblical Hebrew on the college level, and has maintained an Old Testament bible study group, weekly, for the last twenty years.

The lecture will be titled "How Should We Regard Semitic Sources for the Psalms?" He'll consider two specific Psalms, numbers 29 and 93, in their Babylonian and Canaanite historical context, and discuss what lessons should be learned about our own faith-commitments from their historical antecedents. Participation of attendees will be welcome.
