We will celebrate the resurrection of Jesus Christ at our Easter Sunday Services at 10:00 am in the Sanctuary. On Easter morning, enjoy a continental breakfast before services from 9:00—9:45. As a reminder, the entire Church will be celebrating Easter together on Sunday morning; there will be no Celebration Service on Saturday, April 8.

I think like most people, a lot of my church memories are around Christmas and Easter. It is my opinion, but I think Easter often seems under celebrated, and I don't mean this negatively. If you think about it though, we make a big deal of Christmas. Think of all of the shopping, money, and time we spend at Christmas. Even though we know it can be over the top, we do it anyway. We have parties and gift giving and even special songs that hit the airwaves for Christian and non-Christian people to enjoy. On Easter we have the bright colors, the Easter baskets, usually a meal... and a rabbit that somehow found its way in. Frankly, I'm about simplicity so Easter works out well for me and I often wish that Christmas would take the hint.



Before you go thinking I'm the grinch, hear me out. Christmas celebrations are great if done for the right

reasons and I'm all for them as long as I can still go to bed early. But let's actually think about what Christmas and Easter are. On Christmas we celebrate Christ coming into the world as both fully God and fully man. We think about how we have this beautiful moment in time where the hope of humanity was brought into the world: the Savior that has come to help us and rescue us from the forces of wickedness. Now the remembrance of this is a beautiful and necessary thing. But let's think about Easter. Easter is the culmination of the first coming of Jesus Christ.

On the week leading up into Easter and then Easter day itself we see the conquering of evil, the atonement paid for sin, the satisfaction of the wrath of God and Jesus taking on punishment and death in our place. We then see that Christ could not be held by the grave and the resurrection is celebrated thereby giving us eternal life and a resurrection from the grave as well. This is a hope fulfilled and a hope still longed for. Easter created the in between time. Between the death we face on Earth and our resurrection to new life that is to come.

I'm not trying to get you to change your celebrations or write Easter songs, but what I want everyone to remember this Easter is we are celebrating a promise of God that had been in the works throughout the Old Testament; since before time even began. It's a beautiful Sunday and season. Remember how God has worked in your life and in the world and has brought us victory over death and all of the things that hold us down. ## Mission Highlight

Our Spring semester is going great at Snack Packs! We are very excited about Samaritan Community Center's new facility. We plan to move into it this September. This new facility greatly increases our space and ability to better serve our neighbors in need. It will be on the corner of Laurel and 8th St in Rogers.

This school year we have already distributed 145,000 Snack Packs to over 170 schools and head start programs all over NWA. In the Gravette school systems so far this year we have sent 3,560 Snack Packs: 1,330 to Glenn Duffy Elementary, 640 to Gravette Middle, 1,180 to Gravette Upper Elementary and 410 to Gravette High.

Each spring we do a student survey. There are a lot of great comments, feedback, and stories from schools about the students receiving Snack Packs. Here are just a few that help remind me why we do what we do for these kids.

- "The student's teacher always reported that this child was stressed, worried, and hungry both before and after lunch. Since getting snack packs the teacher has not reported any more of those concerns!"
- "Picking up snack packs each week has helped this student build positive relationships. Her behavior has improved throughout the year because she knows that we care about her and her family."
- "I love getting snack packs because my family can't afford these kinds of snacks and it makes my weekend."
