Before the blood drive, please take a few steps to ensure that things go smoothly on the day of our blood drive.

- 1. Drink plenty of water or juice the night and morning before you donate.
- 2. Eat a well-balanced meal around 2-3 hours before giving.
- 3. Bring your photo ID Photo ID is now required for all donors.
- 4. Expedite your check-in process by visiting cbco.org the morning of the blood drive and click on the 'Donor QuickPass' to get your paperwork done before you arrive.

One of the hardest things as a Christian is to consistently stay in a place where we remember that Jesus is first. I have spoken of distractions many times, but distractions are really just an excuse. Distractions are not an issue when we value something. An important thing I have to remind myself of is that distractions are only an issue when we are looking to be distracted. To further clarify, nobody forgets to drink coffee that is a coffee drinker. It is something we look for first thing in the morning and know just what time to stop drinking it to get to sleep. Furthermore, nobody forgets to eat food for a week. Some might eat less and some might eat more, but nobody forgets to eat for a period of days.

So let those realizations sink into your understanding of the relationship with Christ. And get honest. We don't get too busy to walk with Christ and delight in him, we just don't want



to because we'd rather do something else. We don't just get out of the habit of being a follower of Christ, we'd rather follow other things. I know that this sounds tough, but the first step is admitting that as humans we have a problem following Christ and clinging to him consistently. We have to be honest that the world makes the spiritual life hard, but not impossible. We have to be honest about a reality in which things are distracting, but it is usually the fact that our resolve to follow Christ is weak which keeps us from doing what we should.

People do have an endurance problem when it comes to Christianity, and it is an unacceptable problem. We cannot tell the lie that quitting the race is to be understood and "just happens." It is always unacceptable to trade Christ for the world and make weak excuses about why we did it. It is always unacceptable to take the Scriptures Christ speaks to us through and write them off because they're hard to read or make us feel uncomfortable. While none of these things are okay, what do we hear over and over again? "Don't worry about it," "just try to do better." But this is not working. I have heard "I really need to get back into church but..." so many times that now my only response is "when it becomes a priority, you will." Because here's the truth: for far too many people the day never comes when they get around to pursuing the relationship with Christ they've been meaning to get to. They put it off time and again until they've wasted their lives. Because ultimately, it is Christ that gives true life.




Church Recycling News

For 10 years, Earl Lehman has volunteered to haul off the church's aluminum and metal recyclables. He has taken over 51,000 pounds of metal to be sold with the proceeds being donated to our Hummers organization. Earl is now retiring and the Hummers would like to thank him for his efforts throughout the years. We appreciate you, Earl! Going forward, the church will not be collecting metal or aluminum cans, other than what is used on our premises. Cans from beverages consumed here and turned in will be taken to the AARP recycling center with our other recycled materials. Unless another volunteer comes forward to take over Earl's position, we will ask our recycling team to take the cans to AARP and let AARP keep the money to put back into the community. Did you know that AARP recycling center accepts other types of metal, even appliances (no freon items)... at the far east end of their lot? There is a local man who comes to the collection center to pick up things to sell; he needs the income to live. If you have metal to recycle, please take it there instead of leaving it at the church. 
HUMW May Meeting
