

Listening Sessions are Scheduled

Over the next two months, three disaffiliation related 'Listening Sessions' will be held.

The first session will be held on Sunday, July 9, at 2:30 pm and will be led by Rev. Ann Ferris, the Superintendent of the Southwest District of the Arkansas Conference. She will discuss the historical background, options available to local churches, as well as the Conference's policy on disaffiliation.

The second session takes place on Sunday, July 30, at 3:00 pm. At this session, Rev. Dr. Michelle Morris, pastor of First UMC in Bentonville, will speak on reasons to "stay UMC." Rev. Wes Hilliard, pastor of Heritage Church in Van Buren, will speak on reasons to "leave."

The third session will be on Sunday, August 20, at 2:30 pm. At this session, the results of the two previous sessions will be reviewed and a "straw poll" will be taken to determine if the next step in the disaffiliation process, a formal Church Conference, should be requested. Note that only church members who are present at the session may vote.

Pastor's Pen by Rev. Robert Cloninger

As I have mentioned before, I know people struggle to read the Bible. They struggle for two reasons usually: because they do not know where to start and/or because they think they will not understand it. A proven solution I use in my own life is very simple. Make a list. That is exactly right. Just as we are in the habit of making lists to remember grocery items, and things to do, simply make a list of every single topic you want to know about in life and in the Bible. Make the list on your phone, computer, or notebook. Now you officially are out of excuses for not reading the Bible. The reason we make this list is because we then set out to research answers. The Bible is a library containing 66 books and one or many of those books has an answer for you.

You start out simply taking the topic you are curious about and look it up in a topical Bible index (online or in print form). You can even google your question, "what does the Bible say about," then keep studying. Go to commentaries by searching "online Bible commentaries." You can get a commentary from church or the



library, buy one, use one you already have. That's stage one. Now do a deeper search. Google articles and sermons on the topic and take in that information. Read a few articles and check out the authors to make sure they are not questionable. Work with one topic for a day, a month, or a year; it doesn't matter. As you do this research other topics are going to come up, which you then write down on your topic list. You will literally never run out of things to research.

We need to be in the Bible. For some people that's very easy. Some people like to read straight through their Bibles. Good for them, but that is not necessarily you. Trust me, if you spend ten minutes looking up something you are interested in, the time will fly by. And as you move through your topic list you are gaining real, usable knowledge on each one of the subjects. Gaining that knowledge will motivate you and give you the confidence to keep going.

And I am telling you, be bold in asking questions. A great thing to look up if you do not believe me is what the Bible says about using and making money. Look up sermons and articles on it. The Bible and the work of pastors and writers will literally guide you in acquiring and managing wealth.

I firmly believe that the church that has major problems is a church that is not spending time in the Word of God regularly. If every, or at least the vast majority of people in a church read their Bibles regularly and filled their mind with Biblical truth the church would not be able to hold all of the people who would be existing in Biblical peace with one another. What I have found to be so amusing and so frustrating at the same time throughout my ministry is that people have big plans for their church. They want this ministry, that ministry, this group, that group. And what it ends up being is people want to compete with what the church down the street is doing instead of being instructed by the word of God and listening for what He says for their own church situation.

We know what to do. We just have to do it.


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HUMW Book Club

Food Pantry Update & Thank You

Food Pantry Update from Amanda Kelly, Bright Futures District Coordinator

From November when we began the Food Pantry until the last distribution in May, we served 513 families which consisted of 1,177 students. We are continuing to run through the summer and food service also has a free lunch program which families can drive through and pick up breakfast and lunch for students. Because of HUMW's contribution of \$100/month for fresh produce and groceries we had a community member match that donation and donated \$1200 to the food pantry to make it \$200/month.

We also had a local farm, Prairie Woods Farm, outside of Sulphur Springs, recently donate produce after their farmers market to the food pantry. They are going to call back later and let me know if they have more produce to deliver.

I want to tell you all of this because YOU, Highlands Church, are the reason for this. You began the collecting of donations, you have gone above and beyond to donate money to buy fresh produce and groceries and now others are wanting to be a part of that. We appreciate you and everything you have done this past year and so many years!
