There is a monastic group known as the Carthusians. They keep long periods of silence, live alone, and are about as serious as it gets in the world of monks. They have much of the spiritual life down to a fine science, and interestingly enough architecture is a major help. The Carthusians all have their own cell and each cell has three small stories. The division of the cell into three living areas is meant to divide up physical work from spiritual work, secular work. Three forms of work divided up to emphasize the importance of each. We can see as outsiders looking in that the Carthusians know boredom is an awful curse if one is seeking to live like Christ.

It is boredom, after all, that causes fights, doubt, gossip, and all manner of evil deeds. Boredom makes us miserable. It led to the invention of a lot of junk to keep us entertained and comfortably numb. However, the things that have been invented to cure our



boredom can't get to the heart of our boredom. And they can't get to the heart of our boredom because so often we just don't know how to be. Not learning that lesson can wreak havoc on our soul. The big lesson here is watch your boredom; at all times, watch your boredom.

One of the Desert Fathers in our faith was said to have struggled with boredom when he went out to the empty desert so he could pray without distraction. He spent time in prayer and study, but he would still get bored. The story goes that an angel appeared to him and taught him how to make prayer knots and weave palm mats. Now these don't seem like big things, but his quality of life improved almost immediately and his ability to pray became stronger.

As Christians, we cannot get bored. We have to have structure to our day and purpose for our life or we will live in constant sin. In fact, the Church community suffers when people don't plan their lives out and stay busy, because it leads to what I mentioned earlier: fights, meanness, gossip, lack of energy for prayer, and discord. As I have served many years in ministry now, I've grown convinced that the majority of problems within churches stem from the inability of some to entertain themselves. They're like three year olds trying to figure out what to do with their time, so they lash out and stay unsatisfied. And that attitude spreads.

Our society is getting out of hand with the constant need for stimulation. They're always seeking new and different things. They seek until they don't seek God. And they're addicted to something new like a drug. My suggestion would be to have a full life of faith, family, friends, serious hobbies, and not so serious hobbies. Strive to live simply. And develop routine. These are great weapons against Satan.


