It is officially 2024, and I wanted to start the year by sharing a few thoughts.

- 1. It has been a wild year, but I cannot tell you all enough, as my brothers and sisters, how proud I am of you. You are a loyal and faithful communion of God's children and I love you and appreciate the work that you do.
- 2. Take some rest now while you can because we have a lot to do in the year to come!
- 3. Think about what you want to accomplish spiritually in 2024. For example, in my spiritual life I want to accomplish two things (at least). The first thing I want to accomplish is narrowing down my list of theologians and Christian writers that I read. I want to narrow things down to get a full grasp of the work and thought patterns of a few individuals as opposed to snippets of information from thousands. To accomplish this, I am going to spend the year reading to find those theologians and thinkers I will put much more focus on over the next few decades. The



other thing I am going to work on is writing out my Biblical commentary and thoughts in one Bible and document/journal to really engrain the Bible on my heart. Hopefully after several years I will basically have my own working commentary on all sixty-six books of the Bible.

- 4. As I have mentioned, one of my goals as pastor is to teach a lot more this upcoming year, so please keep your eyes and ears open for information on those classes I plan on leading. Please recommend topics for classes as well. As of now, I have the big three-month study on Revelation and the "end times" starting on January 9. The second big teaching I am preparing for is a class on the Tabernacle/Temples. Again, I would love to have some new ideas from you all.
- 5. I have taken stock and come to the realization that I need to do the process differently when it comes to receiving new members. To be fair to both the congregation and the potential members, as well as upholding a true Christian process of membership, I have decided that potential members will need to do three things: 1. They need to have a thorough understanding of our mission and beliefs as a church. Therefore, potential members need to take my class on methodism, or make appointments for private instruction with me. 2. The second part of understanding who Highlands is and what we do is being instructed on the membership vows of the church before they are made. 3. There will be an expected period of attendance that indicates prospective members will be committed to the worship life of the church. I feel these to be fair requirements. From the time I became a pastor I remember being taught (aloud and by expectation) that one of the main goals was to "get new members." Over the years I have realized that that goal is simply not a good goal. We are not a corporation. Numbers are not our bottom line. Discipleship is our prerogative. Remember that our goal since Christ gave the great commission was to make disciples of Jesus Christ. We want people to join Highlands Church that are committed to Christ and who want to work on being His disciple alongside us.

Update from the Gravette School Food Pantry



The food pantry began one year ago and continues to bless so many families in the Gravette School District. In the first 6 months we were averaging serving 79 families a month. Now we are averaging 100 families a month. In the last year we have served 1,166 families which included 2,752 children.

We served 75 Holiday meals, in addition to regular food, on November 16. On December 19, we served 125 Holiday meals.
