The New Year 2024 is moving forward quickly! New year's resolutions were made—some are exciting and making life bigger and better, and others failed and are already a memory. Now the reality of daily living is our focus—the weather, the news, family health and welfare, finances.

Our Finance Committee has created a proposed budget for 2024 which takes into consideration all the items that changed as a result of our recent transition to the GMC denomination and the changes in operating costs. The total budget is \$492,150 which is 4.02% lower than last year's budget.

A new item introduced in the 2024 Budget is the streaming online of the traditional worship service. This will be a great new way to experience our traditional service for those unable to attend. You may have noticed that the "streaming booth" is already located in the Sanctuary. (A big THANK YOU to Rick and Linda Uttley for its construction.) Equipment will be appearing shortly, so take notice as you enter/exit the Sanctuary. More information will be shared as we progress.

It's time to look at our stewardship/tithes for this year that will support this Operating Budget. You will receive your Stewardship packet by US mail shortly. Please take time to read the material and complete your financial commitment card and your service record for 2024. Stewardship Weekend will be February 10 and 11.

John Wesley, the founder of the Methodist movement, believed in the importance of personal holiness and sought to live a disciplined and devout life. He and his brother Charles established a set of 22 questions to ask themselves on a daily basis to help them live a disciplined life. Pastor Robert will be talking about these questions in his sermons, and three of these questions are highlighted in his stewardship letter you will be receiving in your stewardship packet.

Let us thank God for our wonderful church as we look forward to an awesome 2024.

Pastor's Pen by Rev. Robert Cloninger

In 2024 I am focusing on the concept and goal of "going deeper" in the Christian faith. Methodism is and has always been a deep movement. It has always been about people pursuing holiness. The times in history when various Methodist groups have strayed from that understanding have been times of trouble. To further explore the idea of "going deeper" we look to modern theologians. Many of those modern theologians have commented that as individuals and churches, we have very little control over the width of our ministry (numbers). We cannot make the Spirit move in whatever direction we choose when we choose. What we do have some control over is how deeply we pursue a relationship with Christ through holy living. In other words: all we can do is the best we can do in following Christ, it is then up to the providence of God to establish how far that faithful walk spreads. I want to clarify something important. We must remember we are not going deeper or seeking to live in a holier way to go to heaven. We do not earn our



salvation. Instead, we live lives of holiness seeking the things of Christ because we have been saved by Him. To further simplify: the fruit of our salvation is good works; good works are not our salvation.

This year I will be mentioning the 22 questions of John Wesley from the "Holy Club." I encourage you to look up the Holy Club and study the time Wesley lived in. The terms "Holy Club" and "Methodist" were both terms of mockery. People mocked Wesley and his friends for their pursuit of holiness. The 22 questions out of this group help us to summarize the Scriptures and apply them. John Wesley famously said, "let me be a man of one book" referring to the Bible, but he was also practical so he published things like the 22 questions so that people could put the faith of the Bible into practice more easily. These 22 questions break down all areas of life and are perfect to pray through and reflect upon every day.

To give you some examples, Wesley starts out his list by asking the question "am I consciously or unconsciously creating the impression that I am better than I really am? In other words, am I a hypocrite?" So here first he tackles speech, and he then follows it up with another powerful question "am I honest in all my acts and words, or do I exaggerate?" Just within a question or two we learn how to line up our speech so that it is more pleasing to Jesus. Wesley then moves on to ask the question of not just "am I reading the Bible," but "did I give the Bible a chance to speak to me and did it live in me today?" These examples have just been the tip of the iceberg. So, again, please research the 22 questions and implement them in your daily walk to improve your daily walk. I will be writing more and providing more resources on them throughout 2024.

I believe that God is always seeking to save, restore, and heal. I also think that though the world may seem evil in unimaginable ways right now, our witness to Christ and His Gospel is of the utmost importance. We can make change happen, but we must engage. Pray for a new great awakening and live as though you were the host of the new great awakening.
