

## Pastor's Pen by Rev. Robert Cloninger

The liturgical colors we use in church change after Lent and Easter. We go from the purple of lent, which represents repentance, fasting, and abstinence, along with a nod to the royalty of Jesus Christ, to white, which represents the purity of Christ and our being washed anew. However, we soon go into the "long green season." That means the color on my stole and the paraments will be green for a long time. Two questions come from that: Why green? And why so long? First, green is the color of growth, which aligns nicely with the trees and grass, and we are beginning to see more and more (though slowly). Second, it's so long because growth takes a long time.



The idea is that we have had Lent to change ourselves; to repent and study. It has been a time to fast and pray. Then, we

really buckle down during Holy Week and deal with the discomfort and sadness of Jesus' death. But finally, we see the resurrection and remember it in our hearts. All of this should produce new buds of growth in us. And we spend the next several months until Advent letting our spiritual "crops" come in.

When I lived in Marion, I saw the farm fields come alive throughout the summer. I didn't grow up near farms, so seeing the long green season of the church side by side with the long green season of farming life made sense to me. We work, and we work spiritually, to get our "crop" to grow (which is the work of God), and then we labor with the Spirit to get those crops to flourish.

Life is short, and fields don't need to rest like they used to. We don't just let them stay fallow. We give more fertilizer and change the crops out. That's a good lesson for us: never is there a time for us not to produce fruit. We might need to change the type of spiritual crop we focus on for the season, but there's no vacation in the Christian life.

I want to leave you with one of my favorite stories. Growing up, my senior pastor was a wonderful man. He was often quiet and serious, but was sometimes known for his jokes and lightheartedness. He was about the business of God, though. He also had a motto for how he did ministry. Being from a rural area growing up, he knew about crops. And his response to "What's next?" or "What do we do?" would always be the same: keep plowing corn. Why? Because he believed in growing and planting simultaneously. He was never going to quit sowing and harvesting. May the same be said for us!
