Pastor's Pen by Rev. Robert Cloninger

I need to speak more on the topic of Holy Communion more frequently. I do want to apologize for my negligence in this matter. Recently, I spoke about the Holy Communion sermon and Revelation in my class, and I got terrific feedback. From that feedback, I've decided to write and talk more about the subject, which has many titles, including: "Holy Communion," "The Lord's Supper," and "The Eucharist." After I finish two of my current projects, I intend to start working on a Communion pamphlet to discuss its theology and practical implications. My opinion over the years has changed so much. Growing up, I always dreaded the first Sunday of every month. And yes, that continued for a while. I loved taking Communion, but the extended worship service was challenging because of my short attention span growing up. Now, I believe participation in the Eucharist to be an absolute necessity.



The reason for my change over the years is starting to look at what happens when we have Communion in a worship service. Without

getting overly theological, we have to understand that Christ is fully present in the Bread and Cup; it is not just a memorial; the fullness of Christ is truly present. This idea of the presence of Christ has been the topic of much debate and division. However, so much of the debate and division comes down to people trying to figure out how everything happens. We can't figure out how everything happens; we can only trust that Christ is truly present in Holy Communion in a way that differs from other ways.

I also understood that Communion was the answer to so many spiritual problems. It is medicine, and we are all sinsick because of our fallen nature. Yet, Christ provides us with the right medicine in Holy Communion to get us on a path to health and keep us there. We don't want to downplay the importance of other components of Christian living, but for far too long, Communion has backburnered as a mere nod to obedience rather than something that gives us unique access to Christ and provides for us a considerable measure of grace given in the Lord's Supper.

I've experienced pastors who have hesitated to celebrate Communion once a month because they feel attendance goes down. I've never experienced that myself, but if that is the case, that's all the more reason to have it because the Meal is a unique grace. And yes, sometimes that fact requires more teaching. One of the reasons we have an open table is so people can come to the Meal and receive a particular grace for their spiritual benefit. The requirements to take Communion in our tradition are simple: Belief in Christ, confession of sin, repentance, and taking the Meal seriously and with reverence. Other Christian traditions put more rules in place, and yet we have not out of a collective belief that Christ works on people hard through His precious Body and Blood.

I briefly taught the Methodist theology of Holy Communion in my Methodist beliefs class. Still, I plan to teach a class specifically on Communion shortly. I look forward to seeing you at the Table.

Drop a folded dollar into the offering plate to support our Mission Ministry.


