Pastor's Pen by Rev. Robert Cloninger

One of the things I've been following for the past year has been the popularity of people's "deconstructing" stories. If you don't know what that is, it's where "former Christians" talk about some things that lead them away from the Christian faith. I find it interesting that there are a lot of similarities. The stories are remarkably similar, and as far as I can tell, people who are "deconstructing" seem to have come from places where they felt unable to ask questions. I understand many people do either grow up or get involved with groups in Christianity where asking questions is either frowned upon or, for whatever reason, asking questions of the faith is something people feel sinful if they do. Yet, we see the results of not asking serious faith questions, and the results often end up with either a total crisis of faith or the destruction of an individual's faith life.



So what's the answer? We start with the basic idea that asking faith questions doesn't mean someone is less of a believer or needs to be corrected. Most people agree that asking those hard-faith questions is okay and normal. Next, we help people see that their faith questions can be great prompts to grow in their faith. When you get to deep places of faith, questions naturally arise, and the way to go even more profound is to ask the questions that come up. If you think about it, when you're growing up, you have many questions because the world is new, and you're trying to figure things out. In the Christian faith, things are constantly becoming new as we walk each day because God is so big, and the things of Heaven are so broad. Of course, I would have questions. People must be encouraged not to give up. The answer to having a lot of faith questions is not to quit the faith. The answer is to do the work of finding the answers to our questions. The blessing is that Christians have been asking questions for so long that we have many resources to find answers.

You might be going through a time when you feel like you have so many unanswered questions that your faith is suffering. I'll tell you this confidently: if you get your questions answered and stay open to God's voice, you'll be better at the end of your time of deep questioning. Our life on earth can be full of many blessings and, at the same time, many struggles. We must, therefore, be stubborn about the faith, not letting it go and wrestling for the blessing. What we do with struggles in questions not only matters for our personal faith life but also sets an example for others and blesses them in theirs.




Power of One
