#### **Car Show Meal Tickets:**




# 2024 Car Show T-Shirts for Sale

## Pastor's Pen by Rev. Robert Cloninger

Recently, I read an article by Rev. Shane Bishop, a GMC pastor in Illinois. He talked about "going fishing." He wears a unique cross necklace and heads out into the community with it on. If someone comments on it, he stirs up a conversation and invites them to church. When he wrote the article, he admitted that his recent fishing trip into the community came up with zero conversations or invitations. This wasn't a failure on Rev. Bishop's. Why? Because Jesus said to follow Him and that He would make us fishers of men, but notice that Jesus never said we'd always catch. As it is famously said, "fishing is called fishing and not catching for a reason."

When I came into the ministry years ago, the statistics showed that a regular church attender attended at least once a month. In a post-COVID world, I'm not sure there even is a



standard for average church attendance. There are various factors at play currently in the country, but as a nation, we no longer prioritize church. We simply don't hold Christianity as a priority any longer. This understanding leaves us with some options as Christians. One approach would be to argue with the facts, but the facts are still the facts. Another approach would be to get upset and flustered about the situation and then keep getting upset and flustered about the problem, but that doesn't do any good. Yet another approach would be to point fingers and say that it's up to somebody else to fix the whole situation, but that would be putting a lot of impossible pressure on someone or a group to change the hearts of a nation. We do have the option to blame. And there is always the option to give up. Do you see what those options all have in common? They put nothing in God's hands, achieve nothing, and require no personal responsibility. In short, these options are all options entirely counter to the way Christians are to live.

The best option for the current problem is nothing fancy, tricky, or new. The best option is for anyone claiming to be a Christian to go fishing. 87 percent of people who come to church do so because they received a personal invitation. So when did we last invite someone to church? I will tell you from personal experience that you will rarely get a no, but you will rarely get a yes. Most of the time, the person you invite won't attend church. And yet, sometimes, they will. The thing is, most of us were at one point the person invited to church. Maybe some of us came into a church without an invitation. However, for most of us, another person asked us to go to church, a church event, or to get to know Christ.

So, out of love for God and love for your neighbor, start fishing, and don't stop.

## Kids Worship 2024



## **Mission Opportunities**

Thank you to all who volunteered at Samaritan's Feet Shoe Event in Gravette on July 27! It was a blessed event. Our Annual Car Show proceeds support 3 charities and one of them is Samaritan's Feet. Highlands Church provided 200 pairs of shoes (\$25 a pair) for Gravette School students, and with your financial support of the Car Show we will do so again in 2025.

In September, Highlands Church will again be packing Snack Packs at the Samaritan Community Center, 2910 S 8th Street in Rogers. They had such a high number of volunteers wanting to serve with Snack Packs last year that they scheduled the monthly recurring groups, like Highlands, on an every-other-month basis this school year. We help provide food in-secure children with Snack Pack food for the weekend. Our Annual Car Show proceeds also help support Samaritan Community Center's Snack Pack program.

The 3rd charity supported by the Annual Car Show is Bright Futures of Gravette. Bright Futures is a non-profit organization working to see that children have their basic needs met so they can succeed in school and beyond. Highlands supports the Bright Futures on-site food pantry. Collection bins for food are at church entrances and delivered to the pantry regularly. Please note the BF pantry requests we discontinue saving egg cartons for them at this time. When need arises, we will again collect them.

## Storm Damage

The recent storm beginning on Friday evening, August 16, caused major tree damage on our church grounds. The most significant was the large sycamore tree that fell and blocked the main office entrance to the church. Fortunately, none of the buildings on our campus were damaged.

On behalf of the Trustees, I would like to thank all who responded and assisted in the clean up so we did not have to cancel a church service. Volunteers helped to clear our parking lot, remove a tree blocking our maintenance shed, and cut up large debris.

Due to the scope of the damage, we contracted with a tree service to finish the job. The quote was a total of \$3,500 with a breakdown of \$1,800 for the big sycamore tree and \$1700 to finish clean-up and remove all logs and limbs from our campus.

Again, thanks for your help and support. I know many of you had damage on your own property and the fact that you still showed up to help the church means a lot.
