How you can be part of the fun:


- ⇒ **Host a trunk.** Decorate your car as much (or as little) as you'd like. It doesn't have to be elaborate; just fun and full of treats! Please plan to bring your own candy to hand out. Outreach Ministry Opportunities

Wednesday, October 1, we will pack Snack Packs at the Samaritan Community Center, 2910 S 8th Street in Rogers, from 10:00–11:30 am. We pack weekend Snack Packs for food-insecure students in the Gravette School District.

Highlands Church's week to volunteer at Care and Share in Gravette is October 28 – November 1. This is our final week to work at Care and Share in 2025. The Care and Share motto is "People Helping People." Sign up online (hgmcbv.com) or contact Connie Kiefer, our coordinator.

We have a new mission opportunity to spread the Gospel of Jesus throughout the world with Samaritan's Purse **Operation Christmas Child** shoebox ministry! The Gospel is shared with the children before receiving the shoebox gift, which contains a copy of *The Greatest Gift*, a gospel booklet about the gift of salvation being in Jesus Christ alone. This booklet is available in more than 118 languages, with 10 additional translations in progress. After receiving these gifts, children are able to participate in the follow-up 12-week Bible-based discipleship program called *The Greatest Journey*. We can provide small gifts to fill a shoebox (12 × 7 × 4.38") for children ages 2–14. A donation fee of \$10 per box is critical to cover shipping costs. Please make your check to Highlands Church with OCC in the memo line or place it in an envelope with your name and a notation of OCC. Our goal this first year is to pack 50 shoeboxes (provided by Samaritan's Purse). Highlands Church is very generous, and I know we can easily exceed this goal! **Deadline to bring items for packing is October 26.** The list of items needed is below, and school supplies are still on sale, so it's an excellent time to purchase these supplies. If you purchase an item that requires batteries (i.e., flashlight or toy), please include batteries. We have a collection bin near the nursery in the Gathering Area and will have a packing party in late October or early November. Filled boxes will be delivered mid-November to the collection location for this area, which is BV Baptist Church. As you are in Walmart, Dollar Tree, Dollar General, etc., please look for small items to include in the shoebox. Look around your home... you may have donation items either new or gently used. There is a Gift Suggestion list at the Information Station as well as some informational literature. I hope you will prayerfully consider participating in this ministry.
