Howdy Highlands Church Family,

The advent season stirs our hearts to celebrate the birth of our Savior. I love this season. I also love making new friends and getting to know my brothers and sisters of Highlands Church. I'm excited to share that CARE Groups will be reconstituted, reinvigorated, and resume in January of 2026. The Henkels and Stones are busy organizing the CARE Groups for 2026.

I HOPE and PRAY that every member will participate in a care group so that you can get to know one another, truly demonstrate God's love for one another, and enjoy fellowship in Christ. If you are not physically able to participate, the Compassionate Care Team will be shepherding a CARE Group that you can be a part of in 2026. The leaders of the Compassionate Care team will be including you in a group because we want everyone to know they are cared for and loved. Soon, you will be hearing about who is in your group and who your group leaders will be. I'm excited about his discipleship ministry. My wife, Karen, and I have signed up to be shepherds for one group, and are grateful that we will draw closer to Christ and to you through this ministry.

I've recently led a study on Rev. John Burke's book *Imagine the God of Heaven*. The focus is understanding the nature of God from the bible as well as from those who have died and returned to their body to share their Near-Death Experiences (NDE). Three decades of research have gone into this book. The stories you hear from those who died and caught a glimpse of what heaven is like will leave you amazed. The Saturday afternoon study was so well-received and life-changing that I want to offer it on Sunday mornings. However, I don't want to detract from those going to Discipleship studies that meet before worship. So, I will lead the study from 11:20 am to 12:15 pm on Sundays. This is a five-week class and requires the purchase of the book and the study guide (\$25); couples can share the books. We will meet in one of the classrooms in the Ministries Activity Center (the MAC) beginning January 11. We will meet every week for 5 weeks, and conclude the study on February 8.

The change launches on January 4, which will be a Combined Worship Sunday, giving the entire congregation the chance to enjoy cookies together. 


