

## Outreach Ministry Opportunities

Our 2025—2026 dates for packing Snack Packs at the Samaritan Community Center, 2910 S 8th Street in Rogers, are Wednesdays on October 1, December 3, February 4 and April 1, from 10—11:30 am. They have again been blessed with many volunteers and we will pack every other month. We pack weekend Snack Packs for food insecure students in the Gravette School District.

Highlands Church's week to volunteer at Care and Share in Gravette is September 9–13. You may sign up online or contact Connie Kiefer. Our final week to work at C&S this year is October 28–November 1. Care and Share's motto is "People Helping People". Due to the generosity of the many donations and number of volunteers, Care and Share has been able to go above-and-beyond helping those in need for nearly 41 years. In 2024, they donated over \$104,000 to various charities and nearly \$140,000 to medical and utility assistance vouchers. The voucher assistant program allows people from their community that have shut-off notices for utilities and/or medical needs to receive the help they so desperately need.

Care and Share supports five local organizations with monthly donations: Billy V Hall Wellness Center, Northwest AR Children's shelter, FBC Decatur Food Pantry, 21st Century (after school program), and OutReach 58:10, a food pantry that serves our area. The donations made monthly to these organizations are possible because of the sales and financial donations given to Care and Share.

We have a new outreach opportunity to spread the Gospel of Jesus throughout the world with Samaritan's Purse Operation Christmas Child shoebox ministry! The Gospel is shared with the children before receiving the shoebox gift, which contains a copy of The Greatest Gift, a gospel booklet about the gift of salvation being in Jesus Christ alone. This booklet is available in more than 118 languages, with 10 additional translations in progress. After receiving these gifts, children are able to participate in the follow-up 12-week Bible-based discipleship program called The Greatest Journey. For more information about this ministry, their website is: samaritanspurse.org/occ.

We can provide small gifts in a shoebox ( $12 \times 7 \times 4.38$  inches) for children ages 2–14. A donation fee of \$10 per box is critical to cover shipping costs. Checks can be made payable to Highlands Church with OCC in the memo line, or placed in an envelope with your name and OCC noted. You can also give online at <a href="https://newcom/give">https://newcom/give</a> - just click the blue button and then select "Shoebox Ministry" at the bottom of the page that opens.

Our goal this first year is to pack 50 shoeboxes (boxes provided by Samaritan's Purse). Highlands Church is very generous, and I know we can easily exceed this goal! The list of items needed is below, and school supplies are still on sale, so it's an excellent time to purchase these supplies. If you purchase an item that requires batteries (i.e., flashlight or toy), please include batteries. We will have a collection bin near the nursery in the Gathering Area and will host a packing party in late October or early November. Filled boxes will be delivered mid-November to the collection location for this area, which is BV Baptist Church. As you are in Walmart, Dollar Tree, Dollar General, etc., please look for small items to include in the shoebox. Look around your home... you may have donation items either new or gently used.
