

Celebration Worship Service Information

After having conversations with some who attend the Celebration Service, we are making the following changes which will go into effect starting January 1, 2025:

- Combined Communion Sunday Service: Starting January 5, Communion Sunday services will combine both the Celebration and Traditional services at 10:00 a.m. in the Sanctuary on the first Sunday of every month.
- **Celebration Service:** For the remaining Saturdays of the month, the Celebration service will begin at **4:00 p.m. in Fellowship Hall**, offering safer driving conditions.
- No Additional Changes: All other service arrangements remain the same.

Since the changes take effect beginning January 1, we will hold Saturday's service at our regular time of 5:30pm on December 28.

Mission Opportunity - Food Pantry






HMW and HMM Joint January Meeting
