## Spiritual Disciplines

A million-dollar study by an American church revealed what common sense and the Bible revealed to us for over 2,000 years. The greatest spiritual formation, the greatest stride in sanctification, the greatest way to keep daily tuned into the Holy Spirit, is to set aside time each day for prayer and Bible reading (study). If you prefer a devotional in a printed booklet, our church offers a classic daily devotional, entitled *Our Daily Bread*. (Copies are at the Info Station). So we may share in a spiritual discipline together as the body of Christ, you are encouraged to receive the Wake-up Call devotion (it's also presented as a Podcast and on Spotify) each morning in your email. ## Traditional Service Discipleship Class: "Imagine the God of Heaven"

Pastor Rick is offering a five-week Discipleship Class for our Traditional congregation beginning Sunday, January 11, at 11:15 AM, immediately following worship, in the Peter Classroom. This study uses Rev. John Burke's best-selling book *Imagine the God of Heaven* to explore heaven and near-death experiences (NDEs). Each week includes a video and group discussion, along with reading from the book and study guide.

# Finance News

As the end of the year is upon us, we can look back with gratitude for the blessings God has bestowed upon us in 2025. Highlands Church is a very generous congregation, and we are able to meet all our financial obligations for operations and administration in 2025.

The mortgage balance at the end of November was \$84,642. On the Fifth Sunday loan reduction giving November 30, we received \$4,845 which made the balance \$79,797 before the December payment. As of December 18, the mortgage balance is \$77,237.36. It is hoped that end of year gifts will reduce the balance even more. Watch for announcements about reducing the debt. We can burn this mortgage in 2026. Soooo exciting!

Looking toward 2026, the finance committee has proposed an operating budget of \$483,148, which will restore funding for all anticipated programs. During our Stewardship weekends we received 85 estimates of giving for this budget totaling \$370,988. And, since then we have estimates for additional 32 giving units totaling another \$80,000. This gives us about 93.6% of the necessary member giving for the operating budget. So, we are going into 2026 with anticipation of another very successful year.

# Outreach Ministry Report & Opportunities

- Samaritan's Feet – Gravette Students \$ 5,000.00 (200 shoes @\$25 pair)

## 2026 Outreach Opportunities Save the Upcoming Dates

Snack Packs – We will pack snack packs on February 4 and April 1, from 10:00 AM–11:30 AM, for food-insecure students in the Gravette School District. Packing will take place at the Samaritan Community Center, 2910 South 8th Street in Rogers. Volunteers are encouraged to come help and learn more about the services Samaritan Community Center provides.

Care & Share Thrift Store – Located at 103 Huntington St. SE in Gravette. Our next volunteer week is January 13–17, which is expected to be a very busy time. The store will reopen on January 6 after being closed for two weeks for the Christmas break, and volunteer help will be greatly appreciated and needed.

Operation Christmas Child Shoebox Ministry – In 2025, we experienced a wonderful opportunity to share the Gospel of Christ around the world, and we will continue this ministry annually. As you see clothing items on sale, consider picking up something for boys or girls ages 2–14 and placing them in the Shoebox Ministry tub located in the hallway near the nursery. We will collect clothing items, hygiene items, school supplies, small toys, and more throughout the year. Our goal for next year is to fill 150 shoeboxes for distribution through Samaritan's Purse.

## Mission Work in Mexico

Each year I, Brother Jim, take teams to Rio Bravo, Mexico in mission. Many things are done, but most important is the difference being made in the lives of children. Our teams share Bibles, offer hands-on Vacation Bible Schools, and dedicate reading libraries in Spanish for 1st through 4th grade readers in elementary schools. This year I hope to provide books for 3 elementaries.

Please believe me when I say that illiteracy is a huge driver of poverty and desperation in Latin American countries. In Mexico, of those children who do go to primary school, only 55% will complete a secondary education. It robs people of the ability to rise above the most menial of existences. Through the love of Christ at work in us that can change!

Each school receives approximately 500 new books to use in helping the children become literate and to ignite their learning potential. Schools in Mexico are not supported by taxes, and most parents cannot afford to send children to school because of the cost. Therefore, reading materials are almost unknown in households, and only textbooks are found in most schools.

Besides the new reading books, we distribute new Spanish language New Testaments at no cost to all the children who would like to have one. The joy of these gifts is apparent on the children's faces, and their desire to come to school is enhanced. It is my belief that the impact on these children's lives is immeasurable. The cost for the children's books and Bibles for each elementary school is approximately 1,800 dollars. I want to challenge this church to provide books for one elementary school. This is something we accomplish together!

## Start the New Year in Discipleship

The new year is a great time to grow deeper in faith, and Highlands offers two Adult Discipleship classes to help you do just that. The Mark Discipleship Class is a caring group of learners and will resume meeting on December 28, continuing their study in *The Resurrection of Jesus Christ: A Handbook for Christian Maturity* by Bill Bright. This class is well established and continues to grow together in faith and fellowship.

Coming in January, a new opportunity begins with the Matthew Discipleship Class, launching on Sunday, January 4, 2026. This new class will meet Sundays from 9:00–9:45 AM in the Matthew Classroom and will be coordinated and taught by Allen Lovell for the first few months. The opening sessions, titled Bible 101, will explore the Bible's history, organization, and how to study Scripture effectively, followed by a study of the Gospel of Mark. ## Care Groups: Caring for One Another at Highlands

Care Groups are one of the primary ways we care for one another at Highlands Church. These small groups stay connected through phone calls, cards, visits, prayer, and occasional gatherings when possible. He and his wife, Karen, are leading a Care Group themselves and are sharing in the same commitment to connection, care, and fellowship that Care Groups are meant to provide. 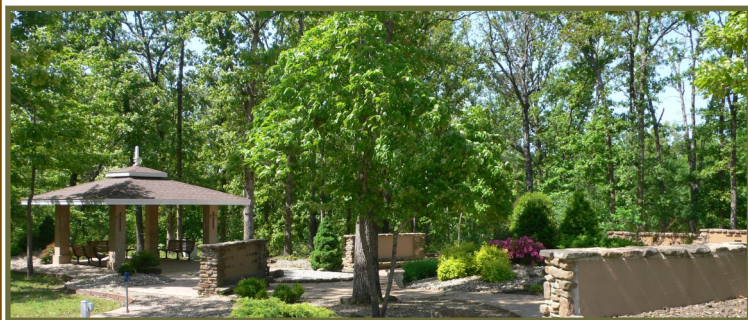
### January HMW Meeting

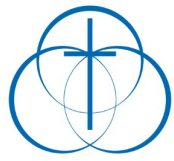
