
Food Pantry—Donations Needed for Holidays



A Shoebox That Changed Two Lives

In 2000, 7-year-old Tyrel Wolfe from Idaho packed a shoebox for Operation Christmas Child, filling it with small gifts and a photo of himself. That box traveled to the Philippines, where a young girl named Joana Marchan received it and cherished it.

Fourteen years later, Joana searched Tyrel's name on Facebook... and found him. Their friendship turned to love, and in 2014, they married. A simple gift became a love story that crossed oceans—a reminder that God can use even the smallest act of kindness to change lives.

As Highlands Church joins this year's Operation Christmas Child outreach, may this real-life story inspire us all to pray over each shoebox we send, trusting God to use it in ways we could never imagine.



In the USA, a 7-year-old boy named Tyrel Wolfe from Idaho packed a shoebox for Operation Christmas Child in the year 2000. He filled it with toys, school supplies, and a photo of himself.

That small box traveled all the way to the Philippines, where a young girl named Joana Marchan received it. She loved the gift deeply but had no way to contact the boy who sent it.

Tyrel flew to the Philippines, and later that year, Joana moved to the U.S. They married in October 2014.
