PROJECTS

Wezesha Stude Mentorship Program

School Mentorship Programs seek to instil knowledge, power, and influence of the mentor for the personal development of the mentee (Student).

Our mentorship program focuses on students in Rural and Slum Schools. We are engaged in 5 schools reaching out to Approx 1200 mentees every week.



Sustainable Environmental Justice Actions

Environmental Justice and conservation have become one of the core issues that need to be addressed to battle climate change and global warming.

Through Our tree planting initiative dubbed
Jitokeze Tupande Miti, we created green spaces in
15 schools by planting over 10,000 seedlings and
conducting environmental education and training
for learners.



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Us For The Street Foundation

It focuses on street-connected children's psychosocial support, health & wellbeing, books club and read-aloud storybook session. The program seeks to reinforce the intellectual capacity and skills of street-connected youths and children. These are critical as it helps to enhance knowledge, improves life skills, and enhances concentration and understanding of the surrounding.

Story Yangu Wellness Program

Story Yangu platform seeks to provide a safe space for young people to be able to share their stories and ordeals so as first to be able to get past them and focus and soldier on, to be able to be an inspiration to those currently under the shadow and to show that what it takes to heal and be whole again.

Real Personal experience shared creates much more impact in the healing process.

Chapati Festival CSR Program

The festival provides a platform and an opportunity to serve the underserved in our community, especially children, women and youths in care institutions

We believe that the festival provides an opportunity for those we visit to share and feel loved, feel included and feel like they're actual members of the society as we share foodstuff, toiletries, shoes, clothes and other donations to help better their living at the institutions.



Pad 4 Her Keep A Girl in School

Most female students are not able to afford the purchase of sanitary pads. Using other means, these girls are left uncomfortable and often unhealthy during their menstrual cycle.

Due to the lack of sanitary products, most girls miss school for a few days each month. Through our Initiative Pad 4 Her, we have been able to provide over 2000 school-going girls with menstrual products and Knowledge on Sexual Reproductive health



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I Vote Peace Digital Campaign

Jijenge do acknowledge that social media is used the most by young people and it's also a critical tool that can help spread peace, encouraging dialogue among people from different ethnic backgrounds and nationalities.

The I Vote Peace campaign is currently being embraced by both the young and old with estimated insight of approximately 30,000 viewership across board. twb.nz/votepeace




World Clean-Up







