# Introduction

Jitokeze Tupande Miti Campaign is youth lead environmental movement that started in February 2021 with the intention of promoting partnership and advocacy for environmental conservation in a holistic and diverse approach. It supports the various efforts by other stakeholders to increase the forest cover of Kisumu county from 0.45% to the recommended 10% by 2024

The value and purpose of trees are enormous, and their existence is vital for our survival. We as young people in Kisumu plant trees to help combat global warming by absorbing carbon dioxide, removing and storing the carbon while releasing oxygen back into the air.

We believe that planting trees in institutions help to improve air quality by intercepting and trapping dust and other pollutants from the air. The shade of trees provides a useful barrier to harmful ultra-violet radiation from the sun as it also provides a conducive environment for students to learn in.

But it's not just for our community physical health that we plant trees it's for the greater benefit, our community mental health. We strongly believe that when surrounded by trees or taking part in nature-based activities, stress and depression levels can be significantly reduced.

Thus the campaign seeks to empower young people to be able to develop a strong passion for environmental transformation and justice, as they become green champions who can confidently advocate for sustainable environmental matters and for protecting public green spaces to be more habitable

# The environment is no one's property to destroy; it's everyone's responsibility to protect.



#### DATA/OUTCOMES FROM THE JITOKEZE TUPANDE MITI CAMPAIGN

Understanding the correct trees to plant in an area and also knowing the trees preference of institutions, tends to determine the trees survival as management is key to sustainability. The following data is an analysis of the campaign over time, The fluctuations and the decline in the number of trees planted was due to the changes in environmental factors such as extreme sunlight, temperature, water and humidity that affect the tree growth and development

# Areas of focus for improved sustainability of trees planted

#### **CONVENERS RECOMMENDATION**

- More engagement of community members and local administration for efficiency in the tree management
- Strengthen environmental clubs in schools to promote increased change in attitude on environmental conservation
- Prioritize indigenous trees for any exercise as they tend to be more resistant to harsh climatic condition
- The right choice of seedlings as per the area outlook and topology
