#### MARCHDOWN/STEPSHOW

The Marchdown/Stepshow is an annual event at our conferences to allow the undergraduate/graduate to showcase their stepping in a percussive, highly energetic art form. It was first developed through the song and dance rituals performed by African American Fraternities and Sororities. In stepping, the body becomes an instrument, using footsteps, claps, and spoken words to produce complex polyrhythms. Stepping has been described as "one of the most exciting dance forms created in the 21<sup>st</sup> century." Stepping goes back to ancestorial roots but has been on college campuses since the early 1900s. Black Greek-letter organizations use programs such as Stepping to support the students academically; socially; and to serve the surrounding community. Stepping also encourages members to express love and pride for their respective organizations, including Omega Psi Phi Fraternity, Inc.
